month of August? When I was growing up, August was the end of the summer, yes; but there was yet an entire month that stretched before me! It was a time of hot days our families to care for one another and continue to learn and not-so-cool-nights; a time of being bored—and almost ready, but not quite—to go back to school. And that was good, because school did not begin again until after Labor Day Weekend, so that we didn't begin school... attend a couple of days...and then have a three day weekend...and then have to start all over again in September. It made sense to just wait until summer was really over before we started school up again.

But the world is very different now, and with August comes not only the rapid end to summer, but the beginning of the school year. Here in Gothenburg I am told that school starts on August 14th—which I thought was very early. And then I discovered that my daughter Bonu's nephew starts school in Ralston on August 12th! So early, it seems to me.

done in the same way, even if we wish they were. The school year is different...the daily schedule is different, with not every day mirroring the one before. Break times are different—and last different amounts of time. And weekends are meant for travel, sports, drama, dance, music...and a host of other activities that we used to try to cram into ever-longer weekdays.

And that last change is really impacting the church. We are used to Sundays being OUR day. "Remember the Sabbath and keep it holy..." but that no longer works well in our society, particularly for our families with children in school (and Grandparents who want to be involved in the lives of their grandchildren). And then there is Jesus' teaching about the Sabbath being made for human-kind, so that we can rest enough to be able to regenerate and be creative—as well as honor God.

Who could imagine that we are already facing the Because it is important to us to be able to grow disciples of Christ that can go out into the world to share the good news of Jesus with others, we are looking for ways to help the way of Christ. Since Sundays are increasingly used for school and other extra-curricular activities, we are trying something new. We are moving our Christian Education time to Wednesday evenings, with an emphasis on families being able to spend time together and to learn in ageappropriate settings. Our Wednesday Evenings will begin with a simple meal, followed by a brief worship service, after which all ages are invited to move into small groups for learning. We will have classes for all ages, including adults and youth.

That doesn't mean that we are giving up on Sundays! Sunday morning we will still have our two worship services and time for fellowship. What we are trying to do is recognize the challenges our families are facing and to walk with them as they work to teach their children what it means to walk in the footsteps of Jesus. Parents are the The school schedule reminds us that things are not always first—and most influential teachers—of the children, and we are trying to change our way of navigating the week so that we can support them in the work that they do.

> Change is all around us. We can deny it, complain about it, be angry about it...or we can find ways to change as well. The Early Church "moved" the Sabbath from Friday evening at sunset through Sunset on Saturday to Sunday morning; talk about a radical shift! We are continuing to recognize the value of Sabbath time and keeping it holy while we also live in our world. May God bless our attempts to change—and recognize in them the ways we are honoring God and loving one another!
