DDA SALUTES THE A.O.H.

In this St. Patrick's Day issue, the Dayton Darting Association would like to pay tribute to the Irish members of our organization. To most DDA members, the A.O.H. is "that Irish place on Xenia Ave. with the cheap beer, friendly bartenders, and unique stamp machines." In the following article, Mike Coogan DDA Treasurer and National Vice President of the Ancient Order of Hibernians, tells the rest of the story.

ANCIENT ORDER OF HIBERNIANS by Mike Coogan

The Ancient Order of Hibernians is an organization of Irish Catholic Americans dedicated to "Friendship, Unity and Christian Charity". It encourages Irish cultural programs, history, music traditions, and is dedicated to a free and independent 32 county Irish nation.

Founded in Ireland in 1545, the first Charter was sent to America in 1836, where the first unit was formed in New York City. The organization spread throughout the United States and it remains today the largest Irish organization in America.

The Dayton unit was chartered in 1889, which makes this our 98th year in the city. In 1958, we purchased the old station #7 Firehouse on Xenia Ave., where members pitched in to remodel it into a clubhouse.

The first dart boards were purchased in 1980 and an intra-club dart league was formed. In 1982, two of the teams decided to join the Dayton Darting Association. Many A.O.H. members were skeptical and some were outright against allowing strangers into the club to shoot darts. However, after five years in the DDA, there has never been a

problem or disturbance at the Hall by any darters. We now have four teams and we extend to all darters a very hearty Caed Mile Failte (a hundred thousand welcomes).

In the fourth century, St. Patrick came to Ireland and converted the pagans to Christianity. The Irish in Ireland have celebrated March 17 as the feast day of his death since that day in 466. It is now celebrated in every country around the world. You will hear many times on that day ERIN GO BRAGH (Ireland forever).

PRESIDENT'S LETTER

As Spring begins to sneak into Dayton, the league is beginning to warm up. The final quarter of play promises to offer a battle in some divisions to gain a berth in the playoffs for division championships. Close finishes are normal for several divisions and the final matches should be intense to say the least.

Some questions remain as to our playoffs. Hopefully, this will answer all questions:

One of the four quarters must be either won or tied for first place to gain a playoff berth.

The ties will be played first. After a single team is determined to represent each quarter, the winners of the first and second quarters will play to determine the first half winner. The third and fourth quarter winners will then play to determine the second half winner. The first and second half winners will then play for first and second place in their division. Competition for third place will be between the second place finishers of each half.

Playoffs will be scheduled as needed to assure your division as fast a finish as possible. Some divisions will require less playoff matches in cases where one team has won more than one quarter. Schedules will be mailed to the bars as soon as dates can be established. This should be by Monday following the last night of league play.

The awards banquet will also consist of elections for the D.D.A.'s Board of Directors. Candidates should contact any Board member or drop a note to the P.O. box. Reservations are also required for the banquet - see information elsewhere in the newsletter.

By announcing your candidacy, your name will be printed on the ballots as well as allowing the Board time to examine your qualifications. By doing this the Board may choose to recommend selection of particular candidates because of skills which may be valuable for the association. This will certainly not preclude nominations from the floor as provided for in our Bylaws.

Once again, all terms are for two years. The office of President and over half of the Trustee offices are up for election this year.




