Martin Luther –

“All the cunning of the devil is exercised in trying to tear us away from the Word”

So how should we measure success? If you are doing a job and success seems slow or ever increasingly difficult do you pack up your bag and go a different direction? In the world's view that is both the appropriate and sensible thing to do. But when it comes to working in the Kingdom of God, is that approach the right way to go? Some churches use that as a way to measure their success and chart their course. Their ministry is based on, what pastor Andre says is, “nickels and noses”. So, what do we do when things are not going the way we want, or we seem to be trapped and “under attack” by the enemy?

Jesus in His teaching makes many comments about what we will face as we seek to serve Him. In **John 16:31-33** see what Jesus tells His disciples, *“Jesus asked, “Do you finally believe? But the time is coming—indeed it's here now—when you will be scattered, each one going his own way, leaving me alone. Yet I am not alone because the Father is with me. I have told you all this so that you may have peace in me. Here on earth you will have many trials and sorrows. But take heart, because I have overcome the world.”*

Here on earth you will have many trials. When you are doing God's work, the enemy will come and try to distract, mis-direct, and move you away from God's path. We know that is a common occurrence for the disciples and those who choose to follow Jesus. The early church endured many afflictions and oppressions to get them to renounce their faith in following Jesus. Listen to what James, the brother of Jesus has to say. **James 1:2-4** *“Dear brothers and sisters, when troubles of any kind come your way, consider it an opportunity for great joy. For you know that when your faith is tested, your endurance has a chance to grow. So, let it grow, for when your endurance is fully developed, you will be perfect and complete, needing nothing.”*

Does God's word say give up and run away? Give in and use the world's measure of success? Of course not, but you can be sure that if you are doing God's work and you are succeeding you will be attacked by the enemy. Further along in James he gives us the answer. In **James 4:7** he writes, *“So humble yourselves before God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.”* I would remind you

Reflections From Pastor Rich (continued)

of Jesus words spoken to you in Luke 10:18-20 "Yes," he told them, "I saw Satan fall from heaven like lightning! Look, I have given you authority over all the power of the enemy, and you can walk among snakes and scorpions and crush them. Nothing will injure you. But don't rejoice because evil spirits obey you; rejoice because your names are registered in heaven."

We need to remind ourselves that being attacked by Satan and his minions is to be expected. However, it is so very important that we keep in mind what Paul wrote in Ephesians 6:12 "*For we are not fighting against flesh-and-blood enemies, but against evil rulers and authorities of the unseen world, against mighty powers in this dark world, and against evil spirits in the heavenly places.*" So, what do we do when we find ourselves up against this kind of challenge? There are three major things that will equip you for this fight, prayer, forgiveness, and The Word.

Prayer, fervent and consistent prayer is so important for each of us, and the church as well. Jesus said, "*Yes, I am the vine; you are the branches. Those who remain in me, and I in them, will produce much fruit. For apart from me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me is thrown away like a useless branch and withers. Such branches are gathered into a pile to be burned. But if you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask for anything you want, and it will be granted!*" And again, in James 5:16 "*Confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The earnest prayer of a righteous person has great power and produces wonderful results.*" As Jesus says if you remain in me and my Words remain in you and as James says if we confess or are willing to forgive and be forgiven, our prayers will be filled with power.

Jesus sets the baseline for forgiveness and its impact on our lives and our ability to withstand the attacks of the world. Mark 11:22-25 "*Then Jesus said to the disciples, 'Have faith in God. I tell you the truth, you can say to this mountain, 'May you be lifted up and thrown into the sea,' and it will happen. But you must really believe it will happen and have no doubt in your heart. I tell you, you can pray for anything, and if you believe that you've received it, it will be yours. But when you are praying, first forgive anyone you are holding a grudge against, so that your Father in heaven will forgive your sins, too.'*" St. Paul writes in Ephesians 4:30-32 "*And do not bring sorrow to God's Holy Spirit by the way you live. Remember, he has identified you as his own, guaranteeing that you will be saved on the day of redemption. Get rid of all bitterness, rage, anger, harsh words, and slander, as well as all types of evil behavior. Instead, be kind to each other, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, just as God through Christ has forgiven you. Finally, the last key is staying in the Word of God.*

Paul has a deep love and affection for Timothy, so we know when he writes to him it is filled with passion, tender hearted mercy, and love. Look at what he says to him about God's Word, 2 Timothy 3:16-17 "All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right. God uses it to prepare and equip his people to do every good work." Jesus endured many temptations and challenges from the world. Here is His response to Satan's first attempt to lure Him away from the right path. Matthew 4:1-4 "Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted there by the devil. For forty days and forty nights he fasted and became very hungry. During that time the devil came and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, tell these stones to become loaves of bread." But Jesus told him, "No! The Scriptures say, 'People do not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God.'" Hear the words of Peter as he shares his wisdom with the church, 1 Peter 1:23 "For you have been born again, but not to a life that will quickly end. Your new life will last forever because it comes from the eternal, living word of God." Finally, the author of Hebrews makes the importance of God's Word vividly clear, Hebrews 4:12 "For the word of God is alive and powerful. It is sharper than the sharpest two-edged sword, cutting between soul and spirit, between joint and marrow. It exposes our innermost thoughts and desires." Finally, this truth flows through all of scripture and is confirmed in, Proverbs 30:5 "Every word of God proves true. He is a shield to all who come to him for protection."

When attacks come against you or the church remember that it is not unexpected, nor does it mean we have no way to defend ourselves or our loved ones. Remember this, Ephesians 6:10-13 "A final word: Be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on all of God's armor so that you will be able to stand firm against all strategies of the devil. For we are not fighting against flesh-and-blood enemies, but against evil rulers and authorities of the unseen world, against mighty powers in this dark world, and against evil spirits in the heavenly places. Therefore, put on every piece of God's armor so you will be able to resist the enemy in the time of evil. Then after the battle you will still be standing firm."

Remember, the sword of the Spirit is the Word of God. Don't leave home without it!

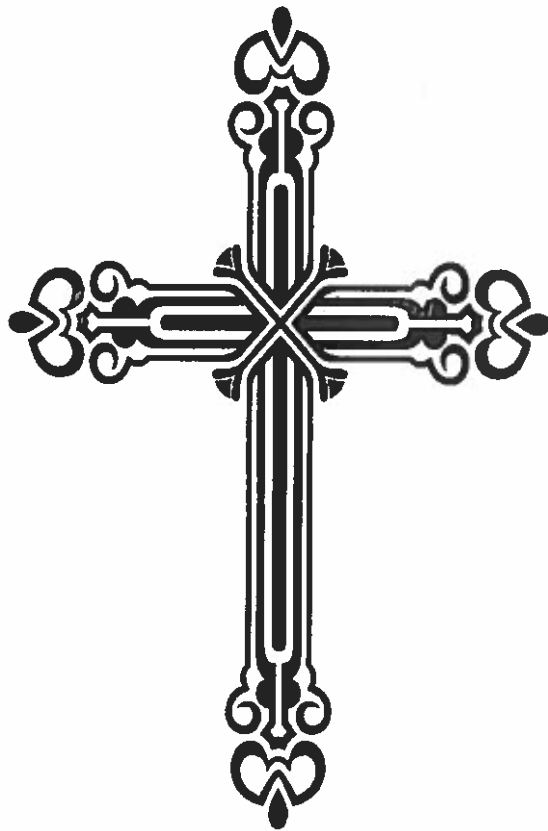

May Council Meeting Minutes

May 14, 2019

The May council meeting of St. Peter Lutheran Church was called to order by President Ray Housh at 6:04 hours, May 14, 2019.

Present: Ray Housh, Roderick Mitchell, Pastor Andre Miller, Mary Hayes, Christina Lobosco, Jim McDaniel, Louise Behnke, Marcy Perry, Pastor Rich Schleier, Lynnette DeLosRios, Debbie Lawrence.

Mary Hayes opened with devotion and prayer with 'Everyday Miracles'.

Presentation by 'Feed the Homeless'

Chandler and Gilbert locations-parenting/family class, ESL class, senior centers and home delivered meals.

Interfaith Housing- alarm system concern, only 1 shower located upstairs

President's report: Ray Housh discussed Council hiatus until September. Council needs may be addressed by email. Ray made a motion to set a low threshold of \$65,000, high threshold of \$100,000, bank balance, with \$25,000 to remain in emergency fund (not including CD). Motion seconded by Lynnette. Hand vote all in 1 vote for no

From the VP, Marcy Perry: discussed uniting the 5 churches and Maundy Thursday low attendance. Also discussed future use of ministry office for the other pastors, use of the remaining office for committee members, Motion to accept by Lynnette, seconded by Mary, all approve, further discussed updating social media and St. Peter.org website

Secretary's report: Mary voted for previous month's meeting minutes to be entered. Seconded by Louise.

Treasury and Finance, Debbie Lawrence and Louise Behnke: increased bills city of Mesa, Visa bill, Payroll increase due to lent, Cox savings of \$35 per month, no update on Insurance quotes, immersible baptismal font to come out of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday offerings, purchase of banners was discussed. Offerings and income amounts differ from amounts shown on Sunday bulletin

Pastor Richard Schleier presented Two Master's Charge Cards for outreach for the 5 churches, Pastors are continuing to meet in unity and prayer, Winter congregants are returning to their 'other homes', praying to find more Mesa year-round members, Pastor discussed Banners, requesting approval for church funds to be used, currently \$1,100 is raised of the \$1,500 cost. Motion was raised by Roderick to approve; Mary seconded the motion. Concern for visibility from Main Street of the banners was raised, motion was amended to hold until update from city regulations, Marcy made the motion for amendment, Ray seconded the motion, all in favor.

Pastor Andre Miller reports the Adult Probation group doing a great job on the grounds. Finances are under control and preventing decline in balances. Two congregations have joined us, which helps the future financial picture.

Christina Lobosco reports Education Committee meeting minutes. Bible school planning underway, list of supplies will be released June 1, one person has volunteered so far, snacks and activities also needed, volunteers needed to distribute flyers in the community, materials for Christmas chosen,

music being ordered, practice begins in September, Sunday School -Jean will be working with Mary and Lynnette for curriculum, Education committee will meet in June

Jim McDaniels presented Worship: Ushers and greeters are down to 2 couples through the summer. Jim and Jan will be leaving 6/1/19. Dean and Sally will also be leaving for a few weeks.

Mary Hayes presented Outreach: Hayes Button willing to take pictures of parishioners, April potluck and birthday cake went well, egg dying activity-kids had a great time, beautiful Easter service, Christmas play plans are under way, bell practice Sundays at 8:30 am Sunday mornings, Beth Moore Thursday evenings at 6:30 pm, Prayer Group Saturday mornings 9am

Roderick Mitchell reported for Property: Projector funds being raised by Women's committee, Current issue with font and color reformatting from office to sanctuary, Epoxy for the Great Hall too costly, may need to consider replacing carpet or installing tile. Banners will need to review City regulations.

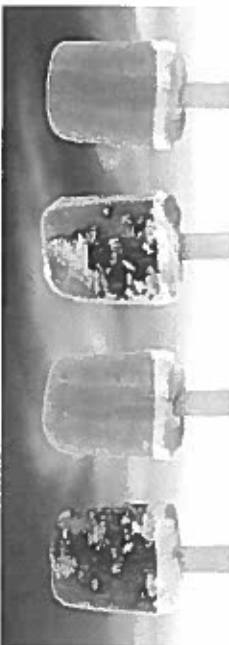
