2020 Caucus Results for Iowa County

The dust has settled in Iowa, the media hoopla has moved on and Super Tuesday is now being dissected, but for the sake of history and those who like to parse these things, here are the results for Iowa County from the February 2020 Caucus.

A total of 215 Republicans participated in the lowa County Republican Caucus. Statewide 32,389 Republicans caucused according to the precinct results posted by the Des Moines Register website. Sitting President Donald Trump won 97% of the vote with 31,464 voting for him with Bill Weld and Joe Walsch each just receiving 426 and 348 votes apiece. "Other" received 151 votes.

A total of 172,655 Democrats participated in the State of Iowa Caucus 2020. (By comparison 171,517 came out in 2016.) Statewide Sen. Bernie Sanders received 45,831 votes and 563 delegates while Mayor Pete Buttigieg received 43,273 votes and 563 delegates. Elizabeth Warren was third with 34,932 votes and 388 delegates. Joe Biden finished fourth with 23,631 votes and 340 delegates. Amy Klobuchar was fifth with 21,120 votes and 264 delegates.

Delegates are apportioned according to a percentage of votes cast with delegate counts per county depending upon the size of the county. Andrew Yang, Tom Steyer also won enough votes to be awarded a handful of delegates with 4 uncommitted delegates due to 1,451 voters handing in a an "undecided" ballot at the final tally. Those four uncommitted delegates will factor in the final state delegate count at the lowa Democratic Party Convention this spring.

In Iowa County 684 Democrats caucused. Pete Buttigieg and Elizabeth Warren tied with 260 votes each thus earning the same number of delegates. Bernie Sanders was third in Iowa County with 240 votes with Joe Biden 4th receiving 200 votes and Amy Klobuchar a distant 5th place with 40 votes. Delegates were apportioned accordingly. The Iowa County Democratic Party Convention is Saturday, March 21 in Williamsburg.

Signs of Spring: Bockwurst is Back!

Yes the Easter Eggs are back as Amana's Easter bunnies turn them out for visitors and locals alike. You can purchase colorful Easter Eggs at the Amana Meat and Smokehouse of course.

And on Wednesday the Amana Meat Shop began producing it's spring favorite- bockwurst! (Pronounced buck-wascht by Amana Kolonisten).

Bockwurst is a finely-ground, pork sausage made with chopped, fresh chives, eggs, milk and seasonings. While it's shaped like a bratwurst, bockwurst is lighter in color, finer in texture and flecked with green chives. It has a milder, some say, sweeter flavor. In the days when each Amana village had its own butcher shop, each village had its own bockwurst recipe with village butchers vying to produce the earliest and the best tasting bockwurst. Good bockwurst depends upon fresh chives, good fresh eggs, whole milk and of course plenty of ground pork so it was an early spring dish when all of these ingredients were available in abundance. Remember without refrigerators butchering slowed down once the weather heated up and what butchering they did in the summer was distributed and eaten that day. Without a frig you couldn't take an extra day or two to ground and stuff pork sausage so in the summer only sausage that had been made in the winter and then smoked was served. Non smoked (fresh) sausage like bockwurst and bratwurst were unavailable in the summertime. That's the reason why bratwurst

is a fall food. In Germany before electricity cool October would have been the first month that a fresh sausage could be made safely hence it appears at Oktoberfest.

In Amana homes bockwurst is associated with Lent and in many colony homes it is served at least once during Holy Week. Bockwurst is most often served with noodles, "Spätzle," or fried potatoes. Yes, you can and some will eat it in a bun, but that sort of downplays its zesty flavor. It can be made as a patty and eaten with eggs or on a pizza and that's a good way to celebrate its best qualities. And hey, it makes a nice little dumpling for split pea or bean soup too.

Today the Amana Meat Shop uses its own original recipe, one perfected by the Amana butchers over time. It's become a popular sausage at the shop which only makes bockwurst in the spring though it can be found in their frozen food case after "bockwurst season."

Utilizing the internet, we looked up bockwurst and read that it was "invented" in Berlin in 1889 by a restaurant owner named R. Scholtz. However, we question this assertion since another German foods website reported confidently that bockwurst was invented in Frankfurt and was really a historical preview of the veal frankfurter. On German menus you can find various versions of bockwurst including bockwurst made with ground veal or ground turkey and in northern German bockwurst made with fish. In Germany bockwurst is often skinny like a hotdog, but in Amana our bockwurst is made from pork and is fat and full to bursting with juicy flavor.


