Read with your kids.</li> <li>• Identifying ways to further reach families with pre-k children to increase the number of students attending Pre-k before Kindergarten.</li> <li>• Preschool open house where all preschools are present to talk to families about what they offer</li> <li>• Finish preschool information list</li> <li>• Community activities or activity centers at local businesses and organizations that promote Talk/Read/Sing</li> <li>• Parent training – helping empower parents to help their kids succeed starting in the earliest stages of education.</li> <li>• Pushing for ALL Austin preschools to become parent aware and supporting them in this however possible (and feasible).</li> </ul>

Then talk to them about other ways they may go about solving the problem.</li> <li>• When you play at the park what is your favorite thing to do?</li> <li>• Do you like pizza or ice cream better?
