STEWARDSHIP REPORT

“But she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood.”

Mark 12:38-44

Like the widow from Zarephath, who baked a cake for Elijah with the small amount of flour and oil she had left for herself and her son, the widow in the temple gave all that she had - her whole livelihood, to God. Such generosity springs from great faith in God’s love for us and sincere gratitude. It is important that we regularly reflect on who we are and whose we are. At our Baptism we are called “a child of God, for so indeed we are.” Do we acknowledge and accept God as Father and Creator? Are we grateful to God for all that He has given us? Is our gratitude to God reflected in our generosity like the widow of Zarepath and the widow in the temple? Jesus was not favorably impressed by large sums that the wealthy contributed out of their surplus wealth. How much of what we have is because of what we want, not what we need? How much of what we claim to be mine is actually surplus that we could share with others in need? How much do we give back to God out of all he has given to us?

THANK YOU!

Robert Gorman, CCHT Executive Director and David Champagne, Matthew 25 Volunteer from St. Charles Church, travelled to Panama City, Florida on October 30 and delivered a 16 foot trailer full of disaster clean up supplies from the people of the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux for the victims of Hurricane Michael. Catholic Charities of NW Florida is running the disaster relief operation at St. Dominic Catholic Church, which was devastated by the hurricane and has a mammoth clean up task ahead before it can re-open, or even receive power. In the meantime it is serving as a disaster relief site serving 2,000 storm victims daily with over 100 volunteers each day.

Thank you to the donors throughout the diocese who brought donations to one of the depot churches. Thank you also to those who have contributed to the relief effort through your monetary donations. Thanks to all of the volunteers who participated in this drive - especially at our depots at St. Bernadette Church in Houma, Sacred Heart Church in Morgan City and the Good Samaritan Thibodaux Food Bank.

"If there's one thing that we know well in our diocese, it's what's needed for disaster clean-up," says Robert Gorman. "The Catholic Charities volunteers in Panama City were very excited when we pulled in with only the items they needed - from diapers to crowbars and hammers, to mops, brooms and buckets, to disinfectant, detergent and everything in between. They are also grateful for the money we brought and the donations that we are sending as we receive them."
