### **Kinder Morgan Trans Mountain Pipeline Project**

The Trans Mountain Pipeline Project was approved by the National Energy Board on May 19<sup>th</sup>, if 157 conditions are met. The proposal has now been moved over to an additional review panel by the federal government and could take up to 7 months for a decision. Rally 4 Resources sees this as more unnecessary red tape and a delay in getting Canadian oil & gas families back to work; we hope for a positive outcome long before December 2016. ### **The Pacific NorthWest LNG & the LNG or Bust Ride**

The guidelines set out by the Canadian Environmental Assessment Agency (C.E.A.A.) state that "An environmental assessment conducted by the Agency must be completed within **365** days." The CEAA began its review process on the PNW LNG project in April of 2013. There have been **6** pauses in the review to date, with the longest pause lasting **6 months**.

The Pacific Northwest LNG project is being billed as the largest private sector investment in B.C. history, promising **4500** construction jobs, and **330** operational jobs with many locals at both ends of the pipeline supplying the facility anxiously anticipating a decision that will get many of them back to work.

PNW LNG received its environmental certificate from the B.C. provincial government in November 2014. The approved certificate included 8 conditions, and an approved draft Environmental Assessment was released on Feb 10, 2016 by the CEAA. On that same day, the CEAA opened up a 30-day window for comments from the public and First Nations on the draft certificate with the expectation that the Minister of Environment and Climate Change; Ms. Catherine McKenna would announce her decision on March 22, 2016. That was not the case, as just before the March 22, 2016 date, Ms. McKenna and the CEAA announced that they would need more answers from the company on the new information they received earlier in the month. The federal government then gave itself 15 days to decide if their questions were answered and up to 90 days to make a decision.

We are fast approaching that deadline, and with communities in Northern B.C desperately depending on projects like this one to be approved, as these communities have now become some of the most highly unemployed in the country, they are waiting for a YES decision. The federal government can still delay this decision further with the recommendation from the Minister of Environment by asking the Governor in Council to extend the time limit (in addition to the three-month extension granted by the Minister). For the people in all these communities, they can't wait any longer. Support for this project and many others are growing.
