The Federal Elected Officials Act of 2021

Section 1

Any person applying for an elected office in the United States, in addition to all current requirements, must allow the federal government unfettered access to the following:

- 1. All academic records.
- 2. All employment records.
- 3. All federal tax returns for the last five years.
- 4. All health records for the last five years.
- 5. All military records.
- 6. An original copy of the applicant's birth certificate.
- 7. Supply a written, certified document stating that applicant will not run for any federal office after completing eighteen years of elected federal service, except for president or vice president of the United States.

Section 2

The federal government shall make these records publicly available through the Freedom of Information Act.

Section 3

Any person unwilling to provide any of the information requested in Section 1 may not run for any elected federal office.

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
