From the Pastoral Associate: Let us reflect on our first reading from Proverbs 8:22-31. It is a bit different way of writing and sometimes when we hit something that is very different, we tend to skip over it. Here it is "Wisdom" speaking. She explains, "The LORD possessed me, the beginning of his ways," If something is with God from the beginning, then it is a part of God. Translation: God is and always has been and always will be wise. Can we ever think of God being stupid, or foolish? No. So, we can trust in our mysterious God because God is wise. Wisdom then explains, "From of old I was poured forth, at the first, before the earth." Wisdom is poured forth from God on all that God creates. "When the Lord established the heavens, I was there." Wisdom is also in the creation of the Earth and us. "Then was I beside him as his craftsman, and I was his delight day by day, playing before him all the while, playing on the surface of his earth; and I found delight in the human race." We and the Earth are not created in foolishness, or chaos, or randomness, but God's Wisdom. What does this mean for us? Translation: it means that all the sciences that depend upon things being true, logical (there can be laws of physics etc.) and dare I say it wise, can exist. It means that our bodies, our very being, our world has an innate and continuing connection to God and His Spirit of Wisdom. Bottom line, there is a wisdom and a mysterious connection between God, and God's Creation of the everything, the Earth, and us. Our planet and bodies were/are created in wisdom. There is a reason we feel peace, feel close to God, when we STOP and are STILL, surrounded by the beauty and truth of Nature. Do we treat our body and the planet with wisdom or foolishness? Do we remain to true to our nature (Creative Grace) and be wise, or do we sadden Wisdom with foolishness and foolishly treat our bodies and planet with disrespect and perhaps even ridiculing God's wisdom by trying to "regenderize" ourselves?
