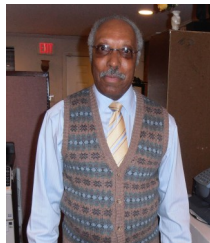

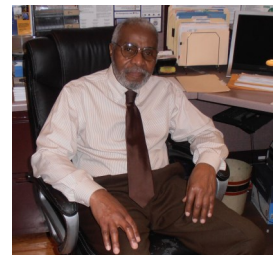

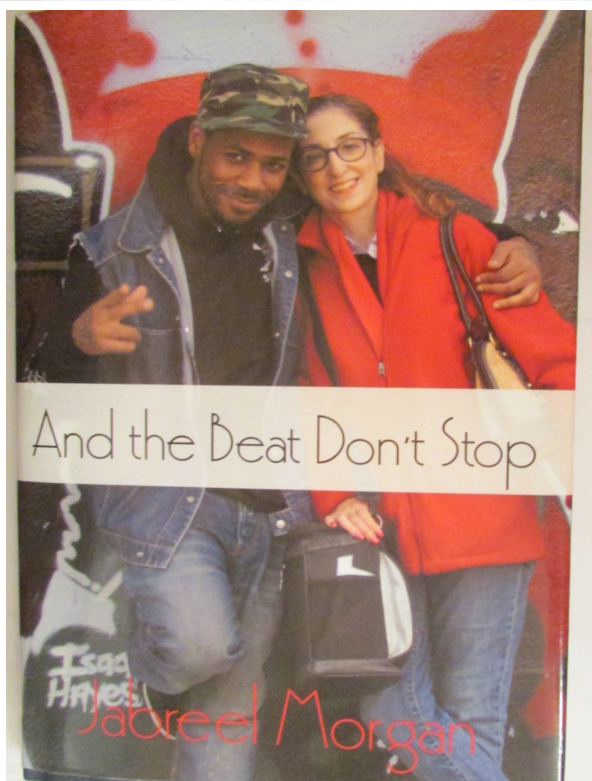


Artist and Author Jabreel Morgan
