

Mission Team Update

Through six months of 2023, Lunch with Neighbors has gathered 75 times serving a total of 8,442 meals! In addition, we have had six monthly brunches where a total of 775 meals were served. We fell just 48 meals shy of serving 10,000 total meals in just six months!

Our volunteer staff are hardworking, committed, and humble servants. They are a joy to be around and a blessing to me and Diana.

Looking ahead, the Neighbors of food insecure number among us continues to grow. Over these six months, we have averaged 113 meals/lunch. The past four months, the average was 120 - during May and June and the July average spiked up to 162 meals for each lunch! So far in August, the average is 159 meals for each lunch!

I predict our feeding ministry will serve around 21,000 meals in 2023. We thank you for your prayers and support as we continue to be led by God's calling upon us to serve our neighbors as ourselves.


