TIME TO MAKE SOME SACRIFICES

Gen. 15:5-12, 17-18; Ps. 27: 1, 7-9, 13-14; Phil. 3:17 - 4:1; Lk. 9: 28b-36

The Lord God said to Abram: "Look up at the sky and count the stars, if you can. Just so...shall your descendants be." Lent is a time to look forward rather than backward! In our spiritual life and in our relationship with God, He is the One Who always takes the first initiative to love us. In today's first reading He takes the initiative and promises Abram that his descendants shall be as many as "the stars in the sky." On his part, Abram must make some sacrifices: "Bring me a three-year-old heifer, a three-year-old she-goat, a three-year-old ram, a turtledove, and a young pigeon." After he made the contribution and fulfilled all the rituals, God made a covenant with Abram, saying: "To your descendants I give this land, from the Wadi of Egypt to the Great River, the Euphrates." Abram submitted himself to the will of God and trusted Him. He put his faith in God.

As He did to Abram, God invites you and me to make some sacrifices, because He wants to reestablish His covenant of love with us. He wants us to sacrifice our pleasures and our time - to come out of our comfort zones so that we may have peace and "possess the land" He has destined for us. God is requesting you and me to put to death our old and sinful ways and to turn back to Him with a contrite and upright heart. He is asking us to make some painful sacrifices during Lent and beyond. Throughout this season of Lent, the Lord is exhorting us: "not to conduct ourselves as enemies of the cross of Christ," and not to let our "stomach be our God," nor should we let "our glory be in our shame." We must not allow our "minds to be occupied with earthly things!" Instead, our minds must be occupied with doing good - generous in Almsgiving, resolute in Fasting and unceasing in Prayer. Lent affords you and me the privilege to remember, "The Lord is my light and my salvation..." and there is nothing I shall fear. God promises us salvation through the passion, the death and the resurrection of Christ, His beloved Son. Thus, we are invited to have an experience of God's love in all that we do.

Like Jesus, Peter, John and James, God invites you and me to go on a journey and accompany Jesus to the mountain where we would be transfigured - we must be alone with Him Who dwells in our hearts. We must encounter Him in our Lenten acts of prayer, fasting and abstinence. Jesus wants us to change from our sinful ways and thus, be transformed by the presence of His light. He wants us to experience the radiance of His light through the sacrifices that we make during this holy season and always. Through our experience and encounter with Him, Jesus wants us to have the audacity to share that radiance with others during this season of Lent. This is a gracious season set aside for us to realize that "our citizenship is in heaven." Our citizenship is not on this earth, therefore, we must stop acting and behaving like people whose "God is their stomach" and whose "glory is their shame." You and I must know that during Lent we are exhorted to take "a leap of faith" with Christ, and hear God, the Father, saying: "This is My chosen Son; listen to Him." Listen to Him and turn away from sins - keep the commandments! Listen to Him Who tells you to "Love God above every other thing." Listen to Him Who tells you to "Love your neighbor as you love yourself." Lent demands from you total detachment from sin and total commitment to God's covenant of love. In this way, "Christ will change our lowly body to conform with His glorified body..."


