


> The way out of this caricature of Christgiving Christ His proper place in Christmas! When He is exalted — these trappings melt into insignificance. His glory transcends everything else!


Try this emphasis this year in heart and home! These other things will be a part of Christmas to be sure . . . but don't allow them to crowd out Christ from the center of your celebration!

ISRAEL Dispersion

Regathering

BY AUSTIN SUTTON A BIBLE SCHOOL PROPHECY THEME

Assyria has perished, Babylon is in heaps, Rome has tottered and fallen, Egypt has become a "Base" kingdom, but the Jews have outlived all their conquerors and walk unscathed amid the general wreck. Dispersed for centuries among all nations, without a national centre, capital, government, flag, or rallying point, secular or religious, they had never been absorbed by the nations, nor lost their identity or national pecularities and characteristics, and we have the unique spectacle of a nation without a king, government, or land, retaining its national existence, and a land that seems to be under a curse, awaiting the return of its legal owners.

No nation has given to the world such a number of great men. Such a man of faith as Abraham; such a great leader and lawgiver as Moses; such statesmen as Joseph in Egypt and Daniel in Babylon; such a king as David, and wise man as Solomon. No nation has produced such seers as the Hebrew prophets, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezeckiel and Daniel and no such man as their man above all men, the "Man of Galilee".

How can we imagine that the Jewish people could remain through all the persecution and the rule of all of the kingdoms that they were under that hated them? The only answer that is known to my mind is that God has a part for them still to do. The day of their favoritism is not over they are still God's chosen people and today we can see that God's handwork is still happening in the land of Israel. But one day God's favor will turn to them out in the open and they will accept Jesus Christ as their Messiah. One statement I like that has been stated before is "We believe that God raises up individuals for special ministries. Why not a Nation? So why not Israel!!! Praise the Lord His coming is not far away and the Jews are the ones that we better have our eyes on lest the day of the Lord should over take us as a thief in the night. The Bible was written by Jews and they watched that no one would tamper with the scriptures and change the meaning of the scriptures. They believed in "Unity" and taught only one God. They were the only People of their day that taught only one God. They were the only one that opened the way for the Gentile group of people to hear the Word of God and a universal God for all men. We also find that through the Jews there was a promise of a Saviour and that was Jesus Christ. Through the Jews a Saviour was born to bear the sins of the whole world that we might inherit eternal life.

THEIR PAST HISTORY

In B.C. 1936, 412 years after the Flood, God called Abraham, a Shemite, from Ur of the Caldees, to be the father of a new nation. Now the Lord had said unto Abraham, Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and from thy father's House, unto a land that I will show thee; and I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great, and thou shalt be a blessing; and I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee, and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed." (Gen. 12:1-3)

Here we see that God gave this promise to Abraham and that God never can be called an Indian Giver because this promise is still true today and will always be.

At Ur, the promises were the land, and that his seed should become a great nation (Gen. 12:1-2). At Shechem the promise of the ownership of the land to his descendants (Gen. 12:7). At Bethel, all the land thou seest and that his seed should be as the dust of the earth for number (Gen. 12:15-26). At Mamre that his seed should be for numbers as the stars of the heavens, and that the Land should extend from the River of Egypt to the River Euphrates (Gen. 15:5, 18). And at Moriah the promise as to the number of his seed was repeated (Gen 22: 16-17). All of these promises that were made to Abraham were confirmed with Isaac (Gen. 26:1-4) and to his grandson, Jacob (Gen. 28:10-15).

Gen. 15:13 And he said unto Abraham, Know of a surety that thy seed shall be a stranger in a land that is not theirs, and shall serve them; and shall afflict them four hundred years;

The next great event in their history was the Exodus. When the time for their deliverance from Egypt came. God broke them off and hardness fell their lot and they cried to God for deliverance. At this time God sent Moses to help them (Gen. 3:14-25).

And God said unto Moses, I am THAT I AM: and he said, Thus shall thou say unto the children of Israel, I AM, hath sent me unto you. And God said moreover unto Moses, Thus shalt thou say unto the children of Israel. The Lord God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, hath sent me unto you: this is my name forever, and this is a memorial unto all generations.

Within a year after their escape from Egypt the Law was given, the Tabernacle built, a sacrificial system of worship was brought in effect. When they had ended their journey and had reached Kadesh Barnea and refused to go up and take possession of the land, God punished them by commnading them to wander in the wilderness for 40 years. There as the Bible relates so miraculously, clothed and fed, and were divinely guided by the "Pillar of Cloud and Fire". Exo. 16:4-36. Then we find that the ten commandments were given to Moses in the 20th chapter of Exodus. Also the last of the 19 chapter on Mount Sinai. At the end of the forty years, under the leadership of Joshua, they crossed the Jordan and entered the Promised Land and took possession of it. (Deut. 31:14-15)

Now begins the third period of their history, the "Times of the Judges" which lasted about 450 years according to history books. The people were not satisfied with being ruled by an invisible King, they wanted a king like the other nations around them had, so they went to Samuel the Prophet and asked him for a king. (I Sam. 8). Samuel was displeased and felt it was aimed at him but when he took the matter to God, God said

Hearken unto the voice of the people in all they say unto thee: For they have not rejected thee, but they have rejected me, that I should not reign over them." I Samuel 8:7.

Samuel then warned the people of what the king they would choose would do to them, but the warning did not avail and Saul was chosen. This was the beginning of the fourth period of their history.

Saul reigned for 40 years and was succeeded by David, a man of God's choice, who also reigned 40 years, and was succeeded by his son, Solomon, who in turn reigned 40 years. During the reign of Solomon the First Temple was built. His reign was most glorious, but its weak feature was that he married so many heathen wives, and permitted them to introduce at Jerusalem idolatrous worship. This was the beginning of the downfall of the Jewish nation.

After the death of Solomon, B. C. 975, the Kingdom was divided, his son Rehoboam retaining possession of two tribes, Judah and Benjamin, and with them Jerusalem and the Temple; and Jeroboam, a person that got it without popular authority, as ruler over the remaining ten tribes, set up his capital at Samaria. This division of the Kingdom, known as "Israel," rapidly declined, and in B.C. 721 the Ten Tribes were carried captive to Assyria. The two Tribes, known as "Judah" survived over 100 years longer, but in B.C. 606 they were carried in Captivity to Babylon, and Jerusalem was destroyed by Nebuchadnezzar in B.C. 587.

THIS (606) IS WHERE THE GENTILE TIME STARTS

The fifth period of Jewish history begins but remember from the time of Nebuchadnezzar the Jews never again secured supremacy but were always under captivity until May 14, 1948. After seventy years of captivity ended in B.C. 536 the Jews, some 40,000, returned to Jerusalem to rebuild the Temple and the City. The Temple was not finished and dedicated until 20 years

later, and the walls of the city were not rebuilt until 70 more years had passed by B.C. 445.

In B.C. 168 Antiochus Epiphanes, King of Syria, took Palestine from Egypt. Twice under his reign the town was sacked and the Temple was desecrated and closed and great cruelty placed on the Jews. The Maccabees rebellion lasted from B.C. 166 to B.C. 40 under the Antiochus Epiphanes reign.

In B.C. 63 Judea became subject to Rome, and during the next 60 years the Roman Empire tightened its grip on the Holy Land. About this time, B.C. 4 Jesus was born at Bethlehem. The claim of the Messiah being rejected by His own people was at hand. They joined hands with the Gentiles in Crucifying the "Lord of Heaven" and in A.D. 70 the Roman armies came, Jerusalem and the Temple were destroyed by Titus and the Jews were scattered among the nations of the earth. The Romans believed that the way to get rid of a culture of people was to move them away from their home land in different directions and for them to inter-marry with a different race and their blood would not be pure and therefore their heritage would be marred.

With the Crufixion of Christ the sorrows of the Jewish race began. Their cry — HIS BLOOD BE ON US AND ON OUR CHILDREN, (Matt. 27:25) has been with them and has just about been fulfilled.

Here are some of the things that happened to the Jews under the rule of different empires.

m A.D.}$ 50 30,000 Jews were killed in Jerusalem under Gessius Florus.

A.D. 66 40,000 Jews were killed under order of Nero.
A.D. 70 1,000,000 Jews were killed in Jerusalem under order of Titus and 97,000 were led away captive.

Then under the bloody hand of Germany many of the Jews were killed.

THE RETURN OF THE JEWS

Once again the Jews will return unto God and they will be the leading nation and all other nations will be jealous of the richness of Israel.

Hosea 3:4 For the children of Israel shall abide many days; without a sacrifice, and without an image, and without an ephod, and without teraphim.

Luke 21:24 And they shall fall by the edge of the sword, and shall be led away captive into all nations: and Jerusalem shall be trodden down of the Gentiles, until the time of the Gentiles be fulfilled. Romans 11: 1-2 I say then, Hath God cast away his people? God forbid, For I am an Israelite, of the seed of Abraham, of the tribe of Benjamin.

God hath not cast away his people which he forknew. Wot ye not what the scriptures saith of Elias? How he maketh intercession to God against Israel, saying. Lord, they have killed thy prophets, and digged down thine altars; and I am left alone, and they seek by life.

Romans 11:11 I say then, Have they stumbled that they should fall? God forbid: but rather through their fall salvation is come unto the Gentiles, for to provoke them to jealousy.

Here we find that the Jews have fallen to give the (Continued on next page)

Gentiles a chance to believe on the Lord Jesus Christ. Also we see that the Gentiles have been grafted in to make the Jews jealous and provoke them in to believing the Lord Jesus Christ when God's favor is once agian poured out on them. Also in Romans 11 we have the story of the good olive tree and the wild olive tree and that some of the branches were broken off and some of the wild olive tree branches were grafted in in their place. Those branches that were broken off were the people of the Jews that rejected the Messiah and the ones that were remaining of the tree are the ones that have accepted Christ and His plan of Salvation. The Wild Olive Branches that were grafted in were the Gentiles that God has given a chance since some of the Jews wouldn't accept Christ. Verse 24 says "For if thou were cut out of the Olive tree which is Wild by nature, and were grafted contrary to nature into a good Olive Tree; how much more shall these, which be the natural branches be grafted into theid own olive tree?" Verse 25 For I would not, breathren, that ye sholld be ignorant of this mystery, lest we should be wise in your own concepts; that blindness in part is happened to Israel, until the fullness of the Gentiles be come in. Verse 26. And so all Israel shall be saved: as it is written, There shall come out of Sion the Deliverer, and shall turn away ungodliness from Jacob: 27. For this is my covenant unto them, when I shall take away their sins.

Here we see that if the Jews repent and turn from their unbelier, God will restore them to their old time place among the nations. LOOK AT ISRAEL TODAY AND THEN ASK HOW LONG UNTIL WE THE GENTILES ARE CUT OFF AND THE NATURAL OLIVE BRANCHES ARE GRAFTED BACK IN?

In Jeremiah 16:14-15 Therefore, behold the days come, saith the Lord, that it shall no more be said, The LORD liveth, that brought up the children of Israel out of the land of Egypt;

But, the Lord liveth, that brought up the children of Israel from the land of the north, and from all the lands whether he had driven them: and I will bring them again into their land that I gave unto their fathers.

Jeremiah 24:6 For I will set mine eyes upon them for good, and I will bring them again to this land; and I will build them and not pull them down: and I will plant them, and not pluck them up. 7. And I will give them an heart to know me, that I am the Lord: and they shall be my people, and I will be their God: for they shall return unto me with their whole heart.

In Ezekiel 37:1-14 The bones that are dry and the nation of Israel that is dead as a country spiritually and now we see this prophecy coming to pass. In the 11th verse "Then he said unto me, Son of Man, these bones are the whole house of Israel: behold, they say, Our bones are dried, and our hope is lost; we are cut off for our part." Their inheritance had been cut off and one day they will inherit it once again and the "whole house" of Israel will once again return to their country as the whole Twelve Tribes. And then they will be restored to their right to worship.

As for a certain date of time I could not set a date. But according to scriptures I could set a date. The date that I would give to someone is found in Luke 21:24 And they shall fall by the edge of the sword, and shall be led away captive into all nations: and Jerusalem shall be trodden down of the Gentiles, until the time of the Gentiles be fulfilled.

The most of them will be gathered back as unconverted Jews. "I will take you from among the heathen, and gather you out of all countries, and will bring you into your own land. Then will I sprinkle clean water upon you, and ye shall be clean: from all your filthiness, and from all your idols will I cleanse you. A New Heart also will I give you, and a New Spirit will I put within you: and I will give you an Heart of Flesh. And I will put My Spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes; and ye shall keep my judgments, and do them". Ezek. 36:24-27.

So what are the Jews to us. Are they as the pictures that the Catholic placed on them in 1215 a rag peddler or a hanggling pawnbroker, a marked man with no feelings about the way people treat them. No this is a nationality of man that has been chosen of God for a work. This is a country that is warning us of the shortness of time and of the Grace dispensation for the Gentile people. We are the Wild Olive Branch and they are the Natural or True Olive Branch. We the christian race are crucifying Christ again in not accepting all the beliefs of Christ. We are the ones that are the Doubting Thomas' and saying "Where is the coming of the Son of Man." The Jews are the ones that are going to have God's favor and are going to recognize Christ as their Messiah. Zechariah 14.


SOME BODY

P. S. And who are we looking for at worship on Sunday? Everybody, Somebody, Anybody — including Y O U!




GIFTS THAT REMAIN

It is Christmas. The season and day is kept in honor of the greatest Name that ever graced the pages of history. That Name is Jesus. Send the proclamation far and wide. A new day of liberty is here, because the Saviour is born. Sin and sickness vanishes into oblivion, the dread and terror of helplessness fades, for the weak are made strong, and captives of the strong-box of sin, hear the glad tidings of eternal emancipation. Christ, the Saviour, King of all ages is born!

The promise long ago was given. God had spoken to man when all hope was only ruin and despair. Devastating sin had destroyed his perfect state. Yet that victory over man in the garden was not beyond redemption, for God decreed, I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed: it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt briuse his heel. Gen. 3:15. Ages must pass for this fulfillment, but in its time and place the promise would be remembered and executed; for God never forgets. The Lord knows that man is of the dust, and that his frame is weak. Like the chaff of the summer threshing floor he is driven away. It is Christ that indeed must come to bring reconciliation and give life. The door of mercy must be opened up, and grace extended to all men. The bowed head, the bended knee, and the confessing tongue finds deliverance and comfort in Christ, and helps to shout the glad tidings anew: this is Christmas.

God gave reassurance of this promise not only once. but many times; not to one person, but to many. To Abraham the word of prophecy was reiterated. Isaac too knew that he had the guarantee of a Saviour for his people. Num. 24:17. That star, that blessed star, I feel that I see it shining now. That literal star that guided the wise men from afar to the holy scene, when Christ was born, was a light that faded not. Isaiah waxed bold in the spirit to acknowledge the Coming One of Israel when he spake saying: "Of the increase of his government and peace there shall be no end, upon the throne of David, and upon his Kingdom, to order it, and to establish it with judgment and with justice from Menceforth even forever. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will perform this." Isa. 9:7. 
