

Everyday Stewardship: Mindful

One difficultly in the life of a disciple trying to live a stewardship way of life lies in the temptations we never actually see. We are too busy thinking about past failures or successes, or we are fixated on what possibilities the future holds that we miss the important things going on in the present. Jesus could be standing directly in front of us, but we miss him because we are looking everywhere except straight ahead.

Being mindful means that we are looking out for how and when God will call us this very day. Our decisions this day will have a huge impact on the future. If we only look to the future, we will miss those important calls to action. We may even find ourselves in a desert of sorts, looking for any way out we can find. However, God may need us to give of ourselves for a reason we cannot yet discern while in that desert. We need to stay awake, be aware, and look for His hand in all things. If we don't, we may even miss the pathway out of that desert when it presents itself.



Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For all members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are from age 18-59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

As we approach the Lenten season this week, our music changes to reflect the season. Our music during Lent will generally be more somber, sparse, and less joyful. This does not mean that it is less prayerful or meaningful. Music during the Lenten season should always be taking our focus back to repentance and conversion. There will be no Gloria during Lent, except on special feast days. We will not hear joyful proclamation of "Alleluia!" again until the Eater Vigil. Also, during Lent we will close liturgy with a simple unaccompanied hymn or in silence. This again is to remind us that our work of conversion and repentance continues as we leave Mass; we are still, 'In the desert', as Jesus was for 40 days. A lot of people think that Lent is depressing and dreary, but in a way Lent is still a joyful time. It is the time when we temporarily renounce all of our lesser joys, whatever they may be, and give space for God to give us the greatest joy, the gift of Himself. We discover that even in the dryness and struggle of Lent, St Paul's words still apply, "Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say rejoice!"
