Our first annual TCS Serve-a-thon was a wonderful experience for the students, staff and parents. The students learned about serving through their faithfocused outreach, and helped their school at the same time. Thank you to all those who chose to donate to this event; your prayers and support were greatly appreciated. Middle school went out to help with manual labor projects at Indian Hills Christian Camp... just in time for summer camps to begin. Fifth grade went to Feeding America where they sorted and packed 1,400 pounds of food for the food distribution centers. Fourth grade worked around Trinity. They pulled weeds, dug out grass from the patio walkways, cut back trees, cleared, swept, and cleaned up around the facility. Third grade visited a retirement home in La Mesa and worked together on crafts with the residents. They ate lunch at Eucalyptus Park and cleaned-up the park before leaving. Second grade enjoyed working on a beach clean-up project beautifying an area well-used by both San Diego residents and visitors alike. First grade wrote letters to military families that will be distributed through Military Outreach Ministries (MOM). Trinity Church is an ongoing supporter of this ministry through Cherie Klaiber. Kindergarten made blessing bags for the homeless. Each student took one to give away to a homeless person as a family and the other bags were given to Erica Yenter to add to Trinity's homeless ministry events. Not only was it a blessing to both those who received and those who gave; It was fun to serve in Jesus' name. We are still taking in donations so there is not a final count yet. We should have a count by next month's Press. Thank you again.
