

Christmas Toys







Lighting in the Shop - Dock Lights

Dock Lights are designed to use on loading docks to see inside of trailers. They are very adjustable and work well in the workshop. We have three of them in our shop. All are mounted to the wall near a lathe. The photos attached show these three plus one in Steve Talmadge's shop.












As you can see some have the incandescent bulbs replaced with LEDs. Simply unscrew the bulb and replace it with an LED.



Bulbs cost about \$5 and the fixtures can be found used for \$20 give or take. Mount them to a solid support since the long arm has a lot of downward force.



Several other club members have these lights but they are not mounted yet. Look to see them soon at Rod's and Lee's.
