On Saturday, April 29, 2017, at 4:00 p.m., the Liberty-Fremont Chamber Singers and the Bjornson Male Chorus of Chicago will join our Trinity Senior Choir in a sequel to last year's concert titled, A CONCERT FOR TRINITY: "Let There be Peace on Earth." Message from the Council President

Your 2017 Trinity Council is listening! And working to make our Church an ever-more effective and powerful witness to the new life offered to each of us through the death and resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

When we work together on projects that benefit our church, we become a community that builds friendships, caring, and also the ability to reach out to the greater community. That's why it's so important and valuable to each of us, to the congregation as a whole and to the greater community, that we come together in significant numbers Saturday, April 1, 9:00 a.m., to clean/spruce up and give a new shine to our beautiful facility in preparation for the celebration of Easter. Can and will you be there on April 1? We're counting on you! Your participation will make our "church home" more inviting to family, friends and neighbors who will join us for Holy Week and Easter, April 9-16.

In response to the input from concerned members at Budget Forums held before our 2017 Annual Meeting, Council decided vigorously to pursue your ideas and suggestions as to how to address our projected offering shortfall over our "bare-bones" budget. Three over-arching themes seemed to run through the thoughts you shared: **evangelism** - reaching out to those who had been more active at Trinity in the past, as well as to others who show an interest in Trinity in the present; **communication** – keeping the entire congregation informed and aware of what your Council is doing, hoping to make a major difference in our bottom line through the year, and **short and long-range planning** – that will keep Trinity's ministry strong and effective for many years to come!

Trinity's Stephen Ministry program is providing one-on-one caring and Christian love to members. It has the potential of re-defining who we are as Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church and setting the invitation and welcoming tone of our entire ministry. Terry Miller, Council Member with a passion for **evangelism** (with help from Pastor Janet), has been spearheading the training of over a dozen members seeking and genuinely listening to and caring about those who have previously but no longer attend Trinity. Creating this atmosphere will make Trinity more welcoming to all. Might you be interested in being a part of the next class in May?

Treasurer, Bill Rayner, with major help from Brock Bentson and Bryan Adams, are preparing presentations on Trinity's financial situation on Sunday, April 23, between services and after the 10:30 a.m. service. At the same time, Council Ministry Teams will highlight Team goals we all pray will keep Trinity moving in a positive direction and make us more useful to our loving God and the growth of our Church and God's kingdom.

Bill Rayner is also leading efforts to evaluate Trinity's property ("assets") to determine whether other ministries might be willing to partner with us, and by God's grace many others, to the benefit of all. And, with Council approval, Jane Gemein is putting together a Grant/Fundraising Team to seek long-term financial support for the congregation.

Also, articles in this issue highlight events that will benefit all include: a "Financial Planning Basics and Your Legacy" Seminar Sunday, April 30, from 11:45 – 1:15 p.m. offered by our Mission Endowment and Memorial Fund Committee, and, Trinity's Music Ministry, with our "Let There Be Peace on Earth" Concert on Saturday, April 29, 4:00 p.m., praising God for all he has done and will do!

What an April! That doesn't even begin to take into account our Holy Week Worship and our celebration of the Resurrection of Our Lord on April 16. Do your best to renew your faith through worship in that holiest of weeks! And believe that because He lives, we shall live also! (John 14) Don't forget Thanks be to God!



40 People Attend World Day of Prayer at Trinity

On Friday, March 3, 40 people from five churches attended the World Day of Prayer hosted by Trinity. There was a potluck lunch, including Filipino dishes, in the Fellowship Hall. The prayer service, written by women of the Philippines, followed in the sanctuary with Rev. Dennis Meyer.

World Day of Prayer is a worldwide ecumenical movement of Christian women of many traditions who come together to observe a common day of prayer and action each year on the first Friday in March. Each year a different country serves as the writer of the World Day of Prayer worship service, interpreting the Bible in their own context, and lifting up issues of mission, justice and peace that are important to them. Offerings collected during the services are granted by WDP national committees to non-profit organizations that deal with the issues identified by the writer-county. The WDP motto is "Informed prayer, prayerful action." World Day of Prayer USA promotes justice and equality for women through prayer, partnerships, service, and celebration.

World Day of Prayer 2018 will be Friday, March 2, 2018, location to be determined. The service will be written by the women of the Republic of Suriname.

Text will be provided to you to cut and paste from Word.


