American Grandmaster challenges World Champ Carlsen

The World Chess Championship's 12-game match begins Friday, November 9, in London with Fabiano Caruana, age 25, of the United States, trying to take the title away from Magnus Carlsen, age 27, of Norway who has been champ since 2013.

Previous to this championship battle, Caruana has played Carlsen 33 times in regular time-controlled games. Carlsen is viewed as the favourite to win the championship and his record against the challenger is 10 wins, 18 draws and 5 losses.

Rating-wise the two players are very close. Carlsen is at the top of FIDE (World Chess Federation) ratings at 2835 while Caruana's rating is 2832 and he is second. Only two other players in the world have ratings over 2800.

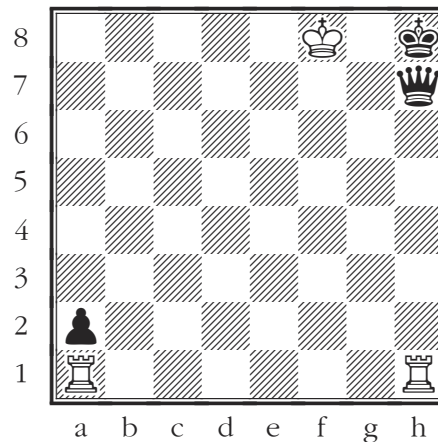

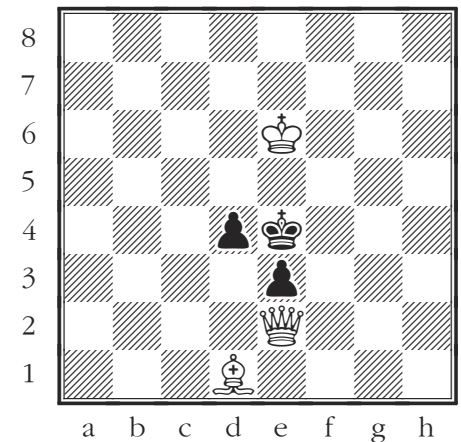
