Member Ashley Wash, the Hotel Catering Manager assisted us in countless ways throughout our event. Round Table Corner

The Modernist Round Table of the Woman's Club of San Antonio

"As traditional as yesterday and as modern as tomorrow!"

The Modernist Round Table is one of twelve Round Tables in the Woman's Club. It was organized in 1923 and has been meeting for 100 years. The primary focus is on mental health issues and community resources for families and individuals of all ages.

Modernist meets on the fourth Tuesday at 11:30 AM in the months of October to May with April being an exception due to Fiesta Season and Events. During the May 3rd General Assembly meeting this year we were your hostess Round Table. We provided decorations and set up dining rooms, tables, and entrance. During the meeting, we lead the pledges to the US and Texas Flags and selected the Volunteer Service Council of San Antonio State Hospital (VSC of SASH), as the Community Care and Concern for this meeting. Thanks so much for your generous monetary donations of \$345.00.

Our partnership with the San Antonio State Hospital, for patients with Mental Health Disorders, began circa 1951, when SASH reached out to the affluent Woman's Club of San Antonio, requesting funds for a new stove in a patient unit. The Modernist Round Table volunteered to pursue this project and raised \$250.00 for this new state of the art stove. Within the next year, SASH reached out to the Modernist Round Table, requesting gently used clothes for the patients, and once again, they received many donations of clothes from the generous Woman's Club members. Before long, so many clothes, shoes, household items, linens, and more were donated in such quantities, that the Modernist requested permission to open a Thrift Store on Campus. SASH agreed and provided building space to set up a Thrift Shop. Pretty soon, these ladies set up the shop, and started monthly 'Trinkets and Treasures' (TNT) sales on campus. In 1952, they formed the Volunteer Service Council of SASH, and in 1953 became a 501c-3 non-profit organization. The VSC of SASH operates under the Department of Community Services & Support of SASH. TNT Sales are the 1st Tuesday of the month from August to June, 0830 AM – 2:30 PM, in Logan Hall.

The monies raised from TNT sales and community donations are used in support of patients and staff as: toiletries, special need items, snacks, and beverages; a birthday and Christmas gift bag to each patient, every year. An annual Pizza Party, Ice-Cream Party, and "Patients and Families Thanksgiving Lunches" on the 2nd Saturday and Sunday of November with all the fixings, DJ music, dancing, and photo booth. The VSC volunteers, Community Service Department and kitchen staff prepare and serve the lunches to all attendees. Annual staff recognition during Health Care Workers Weeks, Administrative Workers, and Grounds-crew Recognition Week. The VSC provides financial assistance for patient's travel when discharged from the hospital, and for family visits as needed. In addition, VSC provides monetary support for repair and upkeep of two campus cemeteries. Thanks to the Woman's Club of San Antonio members for the generous monetary and in-kind donations during the past 72 years to the VSC of SASH.
