Tiernan, Paccar Service Manager for Canada, introduced their new MX Engine with a clear and concise review. Some of the highlights included: HP range 380 to 485; with a B10 rating,



expects 90% of these engines will reach 1,000,000 miles without major failure; uses SCR as the after treatment solution; has a Compound Graphite Head and Block-20% lighter but 70% stronger; no counterweights-uses drilled holes to balance; has a most interesting 'fractured block' main bearing configuration; and a rear gear train-more compact and reduces vibration. ## MAINTENANCE CORNER – A/C

Very shortly air conditioning season will be in full swing!



 Did you know.... when an air conditioning system is opened for repairs it is highly recommended that the receiver drier/accumulator be replaced?
Did you know...misadjusted heater valves or blend doors could cause insufficient cooling from the air conditioning system?
Did you know...compressor lubricating oil can be drawn from the system in the event of refrigeration loss? It is recommended to verify the amount of oil in the system prior to final assembly and evacuation.
