Pope Francis explains in a homily he gave in the Diocese of Rome on December 1, 2013, "Life is a journey. It is a path, a journey to meet Jesus. Our whole life is an encounter with Jesus: in prayer, when we go to Mass, when we receive Communion, when we do good works, when we visit the sick, when we help the poor, when we think of others, when we are not selfish, when we are loving, in these things we always meet Jesus."
