Member Spotlight – Maureen Beavin

How did you first learn about Working Equitation and what attracted you to the sport?

I had met many of the people at clinics and through mutual friends. I was intrigued with working equitation's variety of challenges, the camaraderie, and the willingness of members to teach and see the sport grow.

Prior to Working Equitation what other riding disciplines were you, or are you still, interested in?

I volunteered at the Colorado Horse Rescue for a couple of years, and that's where I met my mare, Isis, who adopted me. Mostly, I was a beginning rider on a green horse, willing to learn from clinics and fellow riders. We do have fun with team penning and trail rides.

What are some of your goals with Working Equitation (e.g. showing, improve your dressage, fun for you and/or your horse)?

Isis and I do have a loving relationship; she's sweet, smart, and very cute. That said, she is a challenge to ride, she does not like dressage, but loves obstacles. My goal isn't to win shows, but to improve our understanding of each other when riding. Someday, I will convince her that I am the lead mare......

What are some of your earliest memories of working with horses and riding?

The picture is 6-year-old me on a pony that looks a lot like Isis. I was destined to own a paint horse one day. I did not start riding until I was 60!

Tell us about your horse (e.g. breed, age, personality, training, how long you've had a partnership).

Isis arrived at the Colorado Horse Rescue with her mother, and many sisters and brothers. We did not know her true breeding, other than she has paint coloring. I sent in hair samples for DNA testing and found she has a little of everything in her family tree--Quarter horse, Arabian, Missouri Fox Trotter, Cleveland Bay, and others.

She and I have known each other for 7 years, and she is the only horse I've ever owned. Sometimes we do have serious discussions and I tell her that I'll send her to a glue factory if she doesn't settle down—but of course I never will, as crazy as she can be.



Tell us something about yourself that most people might not know.

All my children are adopted. My son is Korean, daughter is Chinese, and I have two cats, one dog, one horse and one husband. And a new grandson.

I am a bit of an adventurist. I attended college after high school and then became an over-the-road truck driver for 20 years—my husband still drives, and we own our own company. I went back to college and earned a pharmacy degree and have worked as a clinical pharmacist in a hospital since. Still used to studying, I took up Taekwondo, and achieved a third-degree black belt. Then, decided to learn about horses. Did earn nationally recognized leadership certification and attended a master's program through the University of Florida along the way, too.

I have been on nearly every road in the US, much of Canada, have traveled to 5 continents, and I've lost track of how many countries.

Confederation for Working Equitation National Championship Show

The show will be held **October 4**th- **6**th, **2019** in McCook, Nebraska and will include the cattle working phase.

To qualify for the show you must compete at a Confederation licensed competition and complete all phases, earning an average of 58% or higher for the Dressage and Ease of Handling phases. Scores from shows licensed with WE United will count if the show was officiated by a judge licensed with the Confederation and the scores meet the above requirements. Scores must be submitted to the Confederation within 60 days of the completion of the competition using this form: https://goo.gl/forms/OtLuyUxz5cfCeGys2. Score sheets must also be submitted to the Confederation.

The qualifying period is from September 2nd, 2018 to September 1st, 2019. Entry deadline will be September 20, 2019.
