She joined a very active Kiwanis Club in Tampa that has 150 members. Their club started a small plastic duck race on the river as a fund raiser last year. They sold 7500 ducks which were put in the river and the first one that

made it downstream to a certain bridge won the large cash prize. Their club made \$20,000 on this fund raiser and they will do it again.

Our special guest was Justin Hahn current, WI and Up Kiwanis Governor. Justin is currently the youngest Kiwanis Governor in the USA. I sat next to him during lunch and enjoyed our conversation and his enthusiasm for Kiwanis. Justin said he came from a very bad family situation. In high school he joined Key Club. In college he was very active in Circle K and joined Kiwanis after graduation. He has been in the Key Leader Program for 13 years and attended Kiwanis I-Plan program in 2015 in Dallas. The key message of the I-Plan program is that Kiwanis Clubs need to LOOK TO THE FUTURE AND NOT THE PAST. Things will never be like they used to be. Clubs need to not look at all the things that we used to do and instead concentrate on the future.

Our districts membership has gone from 10,000 to 4,000 over the last 20 years. This year we are on an upswing. The WI-UP District has a net gain of 127 members this year and we have added two new Kiwanis Clubs. The first new clubs in the district in 15 years. Justin gave us items to think about.
