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ORDINANCE NO. 003 -- 2016

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF PHILIPSBURG, CENTRE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING THE BOROUGH'S PARKING REGULATIONS IN ORDER TO ADD SEVERAL HANDICAPPED PARKING SPACES ON N FRONT STREET AND E PRESQUEISLE STREET IN THE BOROUGH.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Philipsburg Borough Council, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 15 of the Philipsburg Borough Code, entitled "Motor Vehicles and Traffic," is hereby amended, in Section 15-313, entitled "Special Purpose Parking Zones Established, Parking Otherwise Prohibited," to add several restricted handicapped parking spaces. Specifically, Section 15-313 hereby is amended to ADD the following:

SECTION 3: Any Ordinance or parts of Ordinances of the Borough of Philipsburg, Centre County Pennsylvania, conflicting with this Ordinance or any part thereof is hereby repealed insofar as the same affects this Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF PHILIPSBURG,
CENTRE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING THE
BOROUGH'S PARKING REGULATIONS IN ORDER TO ADD
HANDICAP PARKING SPACES IN BOROUGH PARKING LOTS

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Philipsburg Borough Council,
and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 15 of the Philipsburg Borough Code, entitled "Motor Vehicles and Traffic," is hereby amended, in Section 15-313, entitled "Special Purpose Parking Zones Established, Parking Otherwise Prohibited," to add restricted handicapped parking spaces in Borough owned parking lots. Specifically, Section 15-313 hereby is amended to insert a new subsection 2, reading as follows:

2. Handicap Parking in Borough-owned parking lots


A. Designation of Lots and Spaces. Borough Parking Lots The following spaces located in Borough owned parking lots are designated as handicapped parking spaces and may be utilized only by those individuals who are handicapped as that term is hereinafter defined:

SECTION 4: Any Ordinance or parts of Ordinances of the Borough of Philipsburg, Centre County Pennsylvania, conflicting with this Ordinance or any part thereof is hereby repealed insofar as the same affects this Ordinance.



BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Philipsburg Borough Council,
and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 15 of the Philipsburg Borough Code, entitled "Motor
Vehicles and Traffic," is hereby amended, to modify Section 15-901, entitled
"Metered Parking Lots Established," to remove designated metered parking lots.
Specifically, Section 15-901 hereby is replaced in its entirety with the following:

15-901. Metered Parking Lots Established.

The Borough may from time to time establish various parking lots or
portions thereof that will be designated as parking meter zones.
Each such lot or portion thereof shall be posted with signs providing
notice of the parking rules and applicable fines. The parking lots or
portions thereof so designated as parking meter zones shall consist
of the following:

NONE. This section is reserved for the designation of
lot(s) or portions thereof.

SECTION 2: The Borough Manager and any other proper Borough
officials are authorized and directed to remove any meters or any signage that
currently is placed anywhere in the Borough and that now are inconsistent with


this Ordinance, and are authorized and directed to take all other appropriate steps necessary to accomplish the purposes of this Ordinance.



S. Front Street	West	First space North of W. Beaver Street	Handicapped





ORDINANCE NO. 005 -- 2014

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF PHILIPSBURG, CENTRE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING THE BOROUGH'S PARKING REGULATIONS IN ORDER TO PERMIT THE MANAGER TO DETERMINE LIMITED EXPERIMENTAL LOCATIONS IN ADDITION TO COUNCIL, DELETING CERTAIN AREAS FROM THOSE WHERE PARKING IS PROHIBITED BETWEEN 2AM AND 7AM, AND DELETING CERTAIN AREAS FROM THOSE WHERE PARKING IS LIMITED TO 2 HOURS.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Philipsburg Borough Council, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 15 of the Philipsburg Borough Code, entitled "Motor Vehicles and Traffic," is hereby amended, particularly in Section 15-105, entitled "Experimental Regulations," to permit the Borough Manager to determine appropriate experimental regulations in addition to Borough Council. Specifically, the first section of Section 15-105.1 hereby is amended to read as follows:

1. The Borough Council or the Borough Manager, either acting individually, may from time to time designate locations upon or along the streets and alleys in the Borough where, for a period of not more than 90 days, specified traffic and/or parking regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be in force and effect and shall designate such locations by proper

SECTION 2: All subsequent language in Chapter 15, Section 105, shall remain unchanged.

SECTION 3: Chapter 15 of the Philipsburg Borough Code, entitled "Motor Vehicles and Traffic," is hereby amended, in Section 15-304, entitled "Parking Prohibited Between 2:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. on Certain Highways," to eliminate certain parking restrictions. Specifically, Section 15-304 hereby is amended to REMOVE the following restrictions:

Second Street	East	Laurel Street and Pine Street
S. Centre Street	West	Presqueisle Street and Oak Street
N. Centre Street	Both	Laurel Street and Alder Street

SECTION 4: Chapter 15 of the Philipsburg Borough Code, entitled "Motor Vehicles and Traffic," is hereby amended, in Section 15-306, entitled "Parking Time Limited on Portions of Certain Highways," to eliminate certain parking restrictions. Specifically, Section 15-306 hereby is amended to REMOVE the following restrictions:

Highway	Side	Portion	Time Limit
Laurel Street	South	Between Front Street and railroad right-of-way	2 hours
Spruce Street	South	Between Front Street and railroad right-of-way	2 hours

SECTION 5: The Borough Manager and any other proper Borough officials are authorized and directed to move, install or remove any signage necessary to accomplish the purposes of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6: Any Ordinance or parts of Ordinances of the Borough of Philipsburg, Centre County Pennsylvania, conflicting with this Ordinance or any part thereof is hereby repealed insofar as the same affects this Ordinance.

ORDINANCE NO. 004 -- 2014

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF PHILIPSBURG,
CENTRE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, REMOVING CERTAIN
PARKING RESTRICTIONS FROM SOUTH FOURTH STREET
AND PERMITTING PARKING ON SAID STREET

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Philipsburg Borough Council,
and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 15 of the Philipsburg Borough Code, entitled "Motor Vehicles and Traffic," is hereby amended, particularly in Section 15-302, entitled "Parking Prohibited in Certain Locations," to eliminate certain parking restrictions on South Fourth Street. Specifically, Section 15-302 hereby is amended to REMOVE the subsection "H," which currently appears substantially as follows:

- H. On the west side of South Fourth Street between Presqueisle Street and Maple Street, except between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and Noon Sunday morning, during which time parking is permitted on the west side of South Fourth Street, a point 190 feet north of Maple Street.

SECTION 2: All subsequent subsections in Chapter 15, Section 302, shall be re-lettered accordingly to accommodate the deletion of subsection "H."

SECTION 3: Chapter 15 of the Philipsburg Borough Code, entitled "Motor Vehicles and Traffic," is hereby amended, particularly in Section 15-303, entitled "Parking Prohibited at All Times on Portions of Certain Highways," to eliminate certain parking restrictions on South Fourth Street. Specifically, Section 15-303 hereby is amended to REMOVE the following restriction:

Highway	Side	Between
South Fourth Street		Church Parking

SECTION 4: The Borough Manager and any other proper Borough officials are authorized and directed to move, install or remove any signage necessary to accomplish the purposes of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5: Any Ordinance or parts of Ordinances of the Borough of Philipsburg, Centre County Pennsylvania, conflicting with this Ordinance or any part thereof is hereby repealed insofar as the same affects this Ordinance.

ORDINANCE NO. 1074 -- 2013

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF PHILIPSBURG, CENTRE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING CHAPTER 15 ENTITLED "MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" BY ADDING CERTAIN PARKING AREAS ON PHILIPS STREET TO THOSE DESIGNATED AS LIMITED PARKING DURING CERTAIN DAYS AND HOURS, AND ADDING A RESTRICTION ON STOPPING/STANDING VEHICLES IN CERTAIN AREAS ON PHILIPS STREET AT ANY TIME.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Philipsburg Borough Council, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1: Part 3, Section 305, entitled "Parking Prohibited on Portions of Certain Highways Certain Days and Hours," of Chapter 15 of the Philipsburg Borough Code is hereby amended to add the following item to the list of time-restricted parking areas:

Highway	Side	Portion	Days	Hours
Philips Street	West	152 feet southwest of the intersection of Duncannon Street and Philips Drive to the Intersection of School Street and Phillips Drive	Every day	8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

SECTION 2: Part 3 of Chapter 15 of the Philipsburg Borough Code is amended to add a Section 303-A, to be inserted immediately after Section 303 and immediately prior to Section 304, which new Section 303-A shall be entitled "Stopping Prohibited at All Times on Portions of Certain Highways." The new Section 303-A shall read as follows:

§151-303-A. Stopping Prohibited at All Times on Portions of Certain Highways.

Stopping or standing, which shall include any act of allowing a vehicle, whether or not the ignition is running, to remain idle, shall be prohibited at all time on the following highway or portions thereof:

Highway	Side	Between
Philips Street	West	152 feet southwest of the intersection of Duncannon Street and Philips Drive to the Intersection of School Street and Philips Drive

SECTION 3: The Borough Manager of the Philipsburg Borough, Centre County, Pennsylvania, or any appropriate officer or employee of the Borough, is hereby directed to add, remove or change any official signs or other traffic or pavement markings to designate the above described zones or areas, in order to carry out the intent of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: Any Ordinance or parts of Ordinances of the Borough of Philipsburg, Centre County Pennsylvania, conflicting with this Ordinance or any part thereof is hereby repealed insofar as the same affects this Ordinance.

SECTION 5: The effective date of this Ordinance shall be ten (10) days after the date of enactment thereof.

ORDINANCE NO. 1064 -- 2010

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF PHILIPSBURG, CENTRE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING CHAPTER 15 ENTITLED "MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" BY ADDING CERTAIN PARKING AREAS TO THOSE DESIGNATED AS HANDICAPPED SPACES.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Philipsburg Borough Council, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1: Part 3, Section 313, entitled "Special Purpose Parking Zones Established; Parking Otherwise Prohibited," of Chapter 15 of the Philipsburg Borough Code is hereby amended to insert, immediately following the existing subsection 1, an additional subsection as follows:

2. There shall be three (3) parking spaces designated as handicapped parking spaces at the parking lot at the Cold Stream Recreation Area, and such spaces may be utilized only by those individuals who are handicapped as that term is hereinafter defined. The first such space shall be eighteen feet (18') north of the Cold Stream Bath House on the west side of the parking lot. The second and third such spaces shall be located eight feet (8') east of each existing picnic pavilion. The designated spaces shall be located in a manner consistent with any federal or state regulations or guidelines relating to access by handicapped persons to public facilities.

SECTION 2: Part 3, Section 313, entitled "Special Purpose Parking Zones Established; Parking Otherwise Prohibited," of Chapter 15 of the Philipsburg Borough Code is hereby amended to insert, immediately following the proposed subsection 2, an additional subsection as follows:

3. There shall be two (2) parking spaces designated as handicapped parking spaces at the parking lot at the Borough-owned Thirteenth Street Athletic Field, and such spaces may be utilized only by those individuals who are handicapped as that term is hereinafter defined. The spaces shall be located in an existing parking lot located off of Spruce Street, one hundred forty feet (140') from the corner of Thirteenth Street, and shall be situated in the lot in a manner so as to provide easiest access of handicapped persons to the athletic field. The designated spaces shall be located in a manner consistent with any federal or state regulations or guidelines relating to access by handicapped persons to public facilities.

SECTION 3: Part 3, Section 313, entitled "Special Purpose Parking Zones Established; Parking Otherwise Prohibited," of Chapter 15 of the Philipsburg Borough Code is hereby amended to renumber all subsequent subsections accordingly, to accommodate this new subsection 2 and Subsection 3.

SECTION 4: The Borough Manager of the Philipsburg Borough, Centre County, Pennsylvania, or any appropriate officer or employee of the Borough, is hereby directed to add, remove or change any official signs or other traffic or pavement markings to designate the above described zones or areas, in order to carry out the intent of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5: Any Ordinance or parts of Ordinances of the Borough of Philipsburg, Centre County Pennsylvania, conflicting with this Ordinance or any part thereof is hereby repealed insofar as the same affects this Ordinance.


SECTION 6: The effective date of this Ordinance shall be ten (10) days after the date of enactment thereof.





PART 1

GENERAL REGULATIONS

§15-101. Definitions and Interpretation.

1. Words and phrases, when used in this Chapter, except for sections or parts to which different or additional definitions apply, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in The Vehicle Code, the Act of June 17, 1976, P.L. 162 No. 81, as amended, except that in this Chapter the word "street" may be used interchangeably with the word "highway," and shall have the same meaning as the word "highway" as defined in the Vehicle Code.
2. The term "legal holidays" as used in this Chapter shall mean and include: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.
3. In this Chapter, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the masculine shall include the feminine.
4. For the purposes of clarity in location and direction, it shall be presumed that Front Street and all streets parallel or generally parallel thereto run in a north-south direction and that Pine Street and all streets parallel or generally parallel thereto run in an east-west direction.

§15-102. Manner of Adopting Permanent Traffic and Parking Regulations.

All traffic and parking regulations of a permanent nature shall be enacted as ordinances, as parts of ordinances, as amendments to ordinances, or as amendments to this Chapter, except where the law specifically authorizes less formal action.

§15-103. Provisions to be Continuation of Existing Regulations.

The provisions of this Chapter, so far as they are the same as those of ordinances and regulations in force immediately before the enactment of this Chapter, are intended as a continuation of those earlier ordinances and regulations, and not as new enactments. Nothing in this Chapter shall affect any act done or liability incurred, or any suit or prosecution pending or to be instituted under any of those repealed or superseded ordinances or regulations.

MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC

§15-104. Temporary and Emergency Regulations.

1. The Mayor shall have the following powers to regulate traffic and parking temporarily and in time of emergency:
 - A. In the case of fire, flood, storm or other emergency, to establish temporary traffic and/or parking regulations; and,
 - B. In the case of emergency or to facilitate public works, or in the conduct of parades, processions or public events, to restrict or prohibit traffic and/or parking in limited areas for periods of not more than 72 hours.
2. Such temporary and emergency regulations shall be enforced by the Police and/or ordinance officer in the same manner as permanent regulations. Any person who shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulations, or who shall move, remove, destroy, injure or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made to give notice of any such regulation, shall upon conviction thereof, be subject to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter for a violation of such nature, and, in case of a violation for which no specific penalty is set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter, to a fine of not more than \$25 together with costs of prosecution or in default of payment of such fine and costs to undergo imprisonment for one day for each \$10 of the unpaid balance of such fine and costs.

§15-105. Experimental Regulations.

1. The Borough Council may, from time to time, designate locations upon or along the streets and alleys in the Borough where, for a period of not more than 90 days, specified traffic and/or parking regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be in force and effect and shall designate such locations by proper signs and markings. Such regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be effective just as if they had been specified in this Chapter. No person shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulations, prohibition or restrictions and no person shall move, remove, destroy or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made by authority of this Section.
2. Any person who shall violate any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter for a violation of such nature and in case of a violation for which no specified penalty is set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter, to a fine of not more than \$25 and costs of prosecution or in default of payment of such fine and costs, to undergo imprisonment for one day for each \$10 of the unpaid balance of fine and costs. Provided, the purpose of this Section is to allow for the test and experimen-

tal determination of the feasibility and desirability of permanent changes in traffic and parking regulations.

§15-106. Traffic on Streets Closed or Restricted for Construction, Maintenance or Special Events.

1. The Borough Council shall have authority to close any street or specific part of a street to vehicular traffic and to place barriers or station police officers at each end of the closed portion, while construction or maintenance work is under way or a special event is being conducted on the closed portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such closed portion.
2. The Borough Council shall have authority to establish a restricted traffic area upon any street where construction or maintenance work is under way and to station flagmen at each end of the restricted portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such restricted traffic area at any time when the flagman is displaying a sign directing that vehicle to stop, or is signaling that vehicle, by a flag or other device, not to proceed.
3. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 and costs.

§15-107. Use of Streets by Processions and Assemblages.

1. For the purpose of this Section, the words "assemblage" and "procession" shall have the following meanings:

ASSEMBLAGE — a gathering of people without vehicles, which interferes with the movement of pedestrian or vehicular traffic on any street.

PROCESSION — a group of individuals, vehicles, animals and/or objects moving along a street in a way that interferes with the normal movement of traffic. A procession shall not include a funeral caravan or military convoy.

2. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or participate in any assemblage unless the person organizing or conducting the assemblage first obtains a permit from PennDOT and the Borough, which shall be issued without fee. Application for the permit shall be made at least one week in advance of the day on which the assemblage is proposed to be held, but in any case where a State-designated highway is proposed to be used, application shall be made at least three weeks in advance of the proposed date. The permit shall state the place where and the date when the assemblage is to be held, the hour when the assemblage may convene and the

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hour by which it shall have been completely dispersed. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or to participate in any assemblage unless the permit has been granted, or at any time or place other than that authorized by the permit.

3. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or participate in any procession unless the person organizing or conducting the procession first obtains a permit from PennDOT and the Borough, which shall be issued without fee. Application for the permit shall be made at least two weeks in advance of the day when the procession is proposed to be held, but in any case where the State-designated highway is proposed to be used, application shall be made at least three weeks in advance of the proposed date. The permit shall specify the date on which the procession is to be held, the route to be followed by the procession, the hour when and place where participants may commence to assemble and form before the procession is under way, the time when the procession may commence to move along its route, and the time by which the end of the procession shall have been disbanded. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or to participate in any procession unless the permit shall have been granted, or under any conditions as to time or route or otherwise than those stated in the permit.
4. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 and costs.

§15-108. Authority of Police and/or Ordinance Officers.

The Borough Police are hereby authorized to direct traffic on the highways of the Borough and at intersections thereof and to otherwise enforce the provisions of this Chapter.

§15-109. Authorization for Use of Speed Timing Devices.

1. The Borough Police Department is hereby authorized to use all speed timing devices for the determination of speed of a motor vehicle as are approved or will be approved by the Department of Transportation of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in accordance with Title 75, Pa. C.S.A. §3368.

2. This Section authorizes the use of said devices upon all highways within the Borough be they Borough, County or State highways, and does also hereby elect to exercise all powers granted to "local authorities" under the Vehicle Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, 75 Pa. C.S.A. §6101 et seq., (1977), as hereafter amended, supplemented, modified or reenacted by the General Assembly of Pennsylvania.
