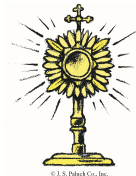
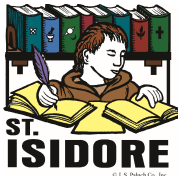

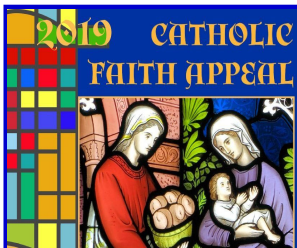

‡**SAINTS/FEASTS OF THE WEEK**‡

April 2-St. Francis of Paola-Founder of the Roman Catholic Order of Minims, St. Francis of Paola was never ordained a priest. At the age of 13, he entered a Franciscan Order friary and spent a year there. Upon his return home, he lived in solitude in a cave on his father's property until he moved to another cave on the coast where he lived for 6 years.

April 4-St. Isidore-Regarded in the Catholic Church as the last of the Church Fathers, St. Isidore was a Bishop, confessor and Doctor of the Church. He is the patron saint of the internet, computer users, technicians and programmers.

April 5-St. Vincent Ferrer-A Valencian Dominican friar, St. Vincent Ferrer was an acclaimed missionary and friar. An eloquent and fiery preacher, he spent the last 20 years of his life spreading the Good News in Spain, France, Switzerland, the Low Countries and Lombardy, stressing the need of repentance and the fear of coming judgment. REGULATIONS ON FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

FASTING: To be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 years (inclusive). On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection (USCCB).

ABSTINENCE: Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays during Lent.

FASTING, ALMSGIVING AND PRAYER are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.

NOTE: If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self denial that are suitable to their condition.

Pope Says Mercy Is Answer

Only the mercy of God will quench the thirst of all people, St. John Paul II told about 50,000 pilgrims gathered in St. Peter's Square on April 22, 2001, for the first world-wide celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday.

“Divine Mercy! This is the Easter gift the Church receives from the Risen Christ, and offers to humanity at the dawn of the third millennium,” the Holy Father said in his homily.

Christ, “who implores forgiveness for His torturers and opens the gates of heaven to repentant sinners,” is a reason for hope not only for believers, but also for non-believers, the Pope said.

Jesus’ love, which in the Resurrection shows itself stronger than sin and death, “is revealed and put into practice as mercy in our daily lives and prompts every person in turn to have ‘mercy’ towards the Crucified One,” St. John Paul II said.

Nuestra ruta de regreso a menudo es un examen de consciencia, por medio de la cual examinamos nuestros corazones y reconocemos nuestras fallas. Quizá necesitamos hacer algunas rectificaciones a quienes hemos herido; podríamos estar llamados a hacer un cambio de actitud o comportamiento. ¿Estás perdido? Ahora es el tiempo perfecto para abrir nuestra mente y corazón, y admitir que has perdido el camino. La Cuaresma es un tiempo cuando admitimos las formas que estamos perdiendo el objetivo y regresar a Dios. A menudo, lo hacemos por medio del Sacramento de la Reconciliación, en el cual confesamos nuestros pecados, recibimos una penitencia y aceptamos de Cristo su abrazo cálido del perdón.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today, “Laetare Sunday,” breaks the somberness of Lent for a little rejoicing, and the readings all summon us to an awareness of reconciliation. One of the best-loved stories of our tradition is today’s Gospel story of the runaway son and the prodigal father. Prodigal, of course, is an adjective meaning “spendthrift or extravagant to a degree bordering on recklessness,” and although the boy maxes out the credit cards, it is really the father who is prodigal with forgiveness.

Part of the excitement of this Laetare Sunday is rooted in the ancient catechumenate. Long ago, midway through Lent, the “elect” were focusing more and more on the gift of reconciliation accomplished for them by Christ and about to be realized in the Easter sacraments they were preparing to celebrate. In some places, the elect were even bedecked with roses on this day. A person bedecked with roses sticks out in a crowd; a person formed by the Eucharist and committed to living a life of reconciliation does, too. That’s you!—James Field, Copyright © J. S.
