Florida Students with Unique Abilities

The Family Empowerment Scholarship for Students with Unique Abilities (FES-UA) allows parents of students with unique abilities to personalize the education of their children by directing scholarship dollars toward a combination of programs and services offered by approved providers.



Who is eligible?

- Students 3 years old to high school graduation or age 22, whichever comes first
- Children with one of 23 diagnoses including, but not limited to: autism spectrum disorder, emotional, behavioral or intellectual disabilities and rare diseases

What is available?

 A scholarship worth on average \$10,400 to cover the cost of private school tuition, instructional materials, home education, tutoring and more







LOOKING FOR A NEW SCHOOL FOR YOUR CHILD?

Apply for a K-12 scholarship worth on average \$7,800 to attend a private school.

All K-12 students, regardless of household income, who are residents of Florida are eligible.

PRIORITY WILL BE GIVEN TO:

- Students whose household income is at or below 400% of the federal poverty level. For example, a family of four could have an income up to \$120,000 annually and receive priority status.
- Students currently in foster or out-of-home care
- Homeless children

Step Up For Students also administers scholarships for:

- Students with unique abilities
- Public school students who:
 - Have been bullied
 - Struggle with reading and/or math in grades K-5
 - Need help with the cost of transportation to another public school

Scholarships for K-12 Students to Attend Private School

The Family Empowerment Scholarship for Educational Options (FES-EO) and the Florida Tax Credit (FTC) Scholarship Program offer scholarships worth on average \$7,800 and cover the cost of private school tuition and fees, tutoring, books and more.

Who is eligible?

• All K-12* students, regardless of household income, who are residents of Florida are eligible

Who has priority?

Priority will be given to families who meet the following criteria:

- Students whose household income is at or below 400% of the federal poverty level. For example, a family of four could have an income of up to \$120,000 annually and receive priority.
- Students currently in foster or out-of-home care
- Homeless children
- $\mbox{\ensuremath{^{\star}}}$ Students entering kindergarten must be 5 on or before September 1
