ROCKY SPRINGS UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

According to available church records and newspaper articles written about it, Rocky Springs Methodist Church is nearing 170 years old. Its history however goes back much further than 1843, the date accepted for the formal constitution of the church and not all past records are available as many burned in a fire in 1919. Rocky Springs celebrated its centennial in 1943 at which time the first known history of the church was written by Mr. J. H. CALHOUN, J. E. COTTINGHAM, Claude DUVAL and Mrs. Annie Sue ROWELL.

The story is told that Rocky Springs got its name from a spring which was once surrounded by and seeped through rocks on the southeast side of the huge sink hole just across the road from the church. When the spring flowed continuously it provided a refuge for the church congregation as well as passer-bys. The water was pure, clean and refreshing, resulting in a deep path being well beaten out down the incline to the waterfall. The overflow of the spring ran into a very small basin in the bottom of the sink. Many times the sink would fill up and overnight be carried away in an underground stream.

On January 7, 1847, Elkanah COTTINGHAM, grandfather of James E. [Elkanah] COTTINGHAM, moved from Molba, South Carolina to Florida and settled about one-half mile from the church. At that time a log building was used for church services and school. Prior to that, an arbor was used for worship. No doubt the location was chosen due to the water supply in the spring and the fact that this was an Indian trail enroute north. The first log church contained a crude balcony which was occupied by slaves. In the

early 1850s it was removed and replaced with a larger log structure. The logs were hewed and the structure erected by the people of the community. Like most churches of the time, church members did the majority of a physical nature. There were three doors and three windows in the building. The ladies entered the east door and occupied seats on that side and the men entered the west door and occupied seats on that side. Negroes entered the south door and sat in the rear of the church. It was customary for the Negroes to partake of the Sacrament after the whites had partaken. One Negro, Madison DIXON, rarely missed a service.

There were no special dates for services as they had to be conducted whenever the minister, called a Circuit Rider could get around as he walked the Circuit. As time went on he rode horseback until the horse and buggy days and later the automobile became the mode of travel. Just before the War Between the States, there were two Camp Meetings held there. Three late members who attended those meetings were: J. Albert COTTINGHAM, Mrs. Ann WARREN, and Mrs. Temperance HADDEN. From these meetings, largely due to the enthusiastic work of the Rev. E. S. TYNER, pastor, the third and present church was erected in 1871. The Rev. TYNER was known to be such a live and effective speaker that often the church could not accommodate the overflowing congregation.

A Quarterly conference for Madison Circuit was held at Rocky Springs on February 24, 1871 with E. B DUNCAN Presiding Elder, Samuel WOODBERRY, Pastor, and James S. SNOW, Secretary, Elkanah COTTINGHAM was elected secretary to succeed Mr. Snow. Stewards reported appeasement for pastor of \$675.00 and \$125 for Presiding Elder and

a building committee was appointed to build the present church. Mr. J. Albert COTTINGHAM (then a 17 year old boy), his father, Mr. Elkanah COTTINGHAM, and Mr. Jim STEPHENS hewed the sills of this church. Mr. Tom RYKARD, father of Geo. F. RYKARD, Sr., Mrs. Isaiah Z. HUGHEY and Mrs. J. R. MARTIN [believed to be Minnie RYKARD MARTIN] *were believed to be the carpenters.* There were no sawmills nearby so the lumber was brought up from the mill at Ellaville, Florida, which helped many your men find employment.

The late John R. WILSON attended camp meetings there in 1867. He ate dinner with his cousin Bettie HUGHEY, grandmother of the late I. Z. HUGHEY, who was camping there for the two weeks service. He loved to reminisce about the Quarterly Meetings and Revivals and how well Mr. Elkanah COTTINGHAM led all the hymns. They were marked (L) long meter, (Cm) common meter, and (S) short meter. There was not a hymn in the book that Mr. COTTINGHAM could not master. After his death, a Rev. PHILLIPS became the song leader.

Rev. Samuel WOODBERRY was the first minister of this church. Others in order as they served included: A. M. CLOUTS, R. M. TIDINGS, E. S. TYNER, and J. T. PHILLIPS. The following names appear on the earliest membership records in order as they united with the church: Moses LESLIE; W. Bellamy DUTTON, N. D. HUGHEY, Mariah Margaret HUGHEY; Randall MORROW, M. W. DUTTON; James A. COBB; James A. COTTINGHAM, Tollie W. DALE, Acie LOPER, Alice RAINS; Peter S. PHILLIPS, Robert PHILLIPS, James A. CAULK, Rufus DICKINSON, Ollie DICKINSON, Daniel BURNETT, William F. WHITTLE, James L. LESLIE; Thomas N. CALHOUN; David

TOWNSEND, Madison LESLIE, Thomas STANTON, Henry T. CAULK, William PONDER ; Frank HADDEN, Thomas F. CALHOUN, Thomas C. MATHENY, Joseph MCCLELLAN, Charles A. CALHOUN, Ann COTTINGHAM, Mary A. CAULK, Lucie STANTON, Rolla A. CARAWAY; Richard L. BEVAN and James T. LESLIE.

Between 1866 and 1888 the following names appeared on the records: William C. CAULK, Robert L. CAULK, Allen TOWNSEND, Docia CAULK; Elizabeth M. STEPHENS; Susan A. DUTTON; Satilla LESLIE and Ann E. WARREN.

The first wedding recorded was that of Chas M. MCLEOD and Julia TOWNSEND, performed by W. H. F. ROBERTS on April 3, 1892. Between this date and 1904 the following couples were married, usually at the bride's home by the Circuit Ride Pastor:

The first baby christened on record at Rocky Springs UMC was Joel PULLIAM, son of Alex and Beula PULLIAM by Rev. Robert O. WIES and it was done in 1898.

The oldest preserved record of the Sunday School (Sabbath School it was called then) was in 1885. It was kept in what was known as the Improved Record and Roll Book, published by American Sunday School Union, Philadelphia, Penn. The officers of the Sunday School were: S. H. CALHOUN, Superintendent, F. H. DAVENPORT, Assistant Superintendent, Kate STEPHENS, Secretary and Treasurer and T. H. PHILLIPS, Librarian. Membership and teachers of the three classes were:

- Class No. III, Primary Class, Joshua HADDEN, Teacher: Charlie DUTTON, Willie HADDEN, Bell CALHOUN, Eula DUTTON, Rosa

DUTTON, Albert PHILLIPS, Lala LESLIE, Albert (Al) DUTTON, Netta COTTINGHAM, and Randell HADDEN.

Past church records indicate the following are among the oldest Trustees and Stewards of the church: Thomas CALHOUN, Steve DUVAL, Thomas F. CALHOUN, Lewis LESLIE, James Albert COTTINGHAM and James H. LESLIE.

The harbor, the two log buildings and present structure actually occupied this sacred spot for 31 years before a deed was executed. When the deed was signed, September 12, 1874, the following were members of the Charge Board of Trustees: Daniel BURNETT, William C. WHITTLE, James L. LESLIE, Richard J. BEVAN, and Thomas M. CALHOUN. Those who made the deed were: Archbold, Susan COODY, William COODY and John COODY's children and heirs of the late Lewis T. COODY. The four acres of land were purchased for \$35.00.

CELETE COWART LESLIE

The sweet gentle spirit of Celete COWART LESLIE was borne away to

the Great Beyond on Sunday afternoon, May seventeenth at five o'clock. For seven years her health had rapidly declined and for the past five years she was confined to an invalid chair continued illness and patient sufferings seemed to cause her spotless character and sweet spiritual light to shine the brighter among those who knew her. The thread of her beautiful life, having been under such strain during late years was snapped with practically no warning to the loved ones. One hour before her soul took its flight from this world of sufferings and cares, to join the Angel Choir in its heavenly home, she sat on the front porch of her home, laughing and talking with her loving husband, apparently as well as she had been for some time. Celeste COWART, daughter of John and Mary Jane COWART, was born in Pinetta, Florida, September 17, 1879, being fifty-one years and eight months of age at the time of her death. Her parents preceded her to the grave by several years, but she was the first of eight children, who reached maturity, to join their parents in the happy Realms of the blessed. Her brothers are: W. G. COWART of Nocatee, J. B. COWART of Miami, and O. P. COWART of Tallahassee and her sisters: Mrs. Mattie VARN of Hahira, Georgia, Mrs. Annie SIMMS of Miami, and Mrs. Lee HARRELL and Mrs. J. E. COTTINGHAM, both of Madison. On December 17, 1896, she was joined in holy matrimony to Andrew L. LESLIE of Madison. To this happy union were born three children, M. C. LESLIE, who died in infancy, Mildred LESLIE and Leland LESLIE, who with their father survive her. Also left to mourn her going is a devoted foster daughter, Mrs. Drew C. SWEAT of Raiford, Florida, who was adopted in infancy in 1911. The deceased was an ideal citizen, an esteemed

Woodman Circle Sovereign, a faithful Christian, a consistent member of the M.E. church South and Woman's Missionary Society of Pinetta. For many years she was an active leader in her church, teacher of the young peoples' Sunday School class, an ardent worker in all movements for the welfare of her community and school, guardian of her Woodman Circle Grove and a good friend and neighbor. But ill health disabled her for these active services some time ago, still her heart and interests were in these noble works and disease never conquered her spirit of enthusiasm. She died as she had lived, hoping and planning for the future. Her life has been an inspiration and noble influence in the lives of innumerable friends and loved ones. No better proof of the love and esteem in which she was held could be shown than that throughout her long illness and death she was ever surrounded by friends, each trying in some way to demonstrate love, sympathy and appreciation for her. Interment was made in Mt. Horeb cemetery on Monday afternoon at 4:30 o'clock, amid a great concourse of sorrowing friends and relatives. The religious services were conducted by her pastor, Rev. Paul Anderson, who spoke beautifully of her life, bringing sweet consolation to the grieved ones. Other very appropriate services were conducted by the Woodmen Circle, Grove No. 211, of which the deceased was a past guardian, and the Junior Grove No. 50. These groves will conduct a memorial service soon. As had been her expressed wish, the pall bearers were chosen among her Sunday School class of some few years ago, being Messrs. Q. H. WARREN, Edd GRAY, Michell ALLEN, J. T. WOODWARD, Lewis and Allen MORSE. Undertaker Ulmer was active in arranging plans so nicely. Many, many

beautiful floral offerings covered her final resting place. We would especially mention lovely bouquets given by the Woodmen Circle, Epworth League, Woman's Missionary Society and the Sunday School. Funeral services were so very much in keeping with her life--one of purity, peaceful quietness, sincerity and simple beauty.

CAULK was first married to Miss Mattie BURNETT, Dec., 1888 with whom he lived happily until death claimed her Feb., 1927. He was next married to Miss Etta MORROW, to this union was born one daughter, Robbie Lee, age 13. The early part of his life he was engaged in farming and the mercantile business, but later he entered the real estate business. His entire life was spent in Madison and Madison county, Fla. He was a loving father and devoted husband and a good citizen. Besides a wife and daughter he leaves one sister, Mrs. Tempie HADDEN, three nephews, Colon CAULK and Tom HADDEN of Madison, Fla. and Hunter CAULK of Day Town, Fla., also five nieces, Mrs. Dossia BURNETT, Mrs. Dessie WILLIAMS, and Mrs. Eva SMITH of Madison county, Miss Mary Lee CAULK of Quitman, Ga.,

**J. A. COTTINGHAM,
WELL KNOWN CITIZEN
PASSES AWAY**

Mr. J. A. COTTINGHAM, age 85, prominent lifelong citizen of Madison County, died in a Valdosta hospital at 8:30 o'clock Wednesday morning, July 13, following a brief illness. Mr. James Albert COTTINGHAM was born in Madison County June 21, 1853, son of Elkanah COTTINGHAM and his wife Ann CAULK COTTINGHAM. He was married on January 27, 1877 to Miss Eliza DUTTON, who preceded him in death May 25, 1938. Seven children were born to them, three of whom survive. They are J. E. COTTINGHAM and Mrs. F. H. HADDEN, Madison and W. T. COTTINGHAM of Douglas, Georgia. Mr. Cottingham was engaged in general farming throughout his life, making a notable success of it. In late years, he lived retired in his home in East Madison. His passing makes a vacancy in his community where his kindly spirit and friendly, helpful disposition had endeared him to everyone. He was a member of the Rocky Springs Methodist Church and in all his dealings with his fellowman had

exemplified its teachings. Funeral services were held at Rocky Springs church yesterday morning, conducted by the Pastor, Rev. L. P. DRISKELL, assisted by Rev. F. P. STEINMEYER of the First Methodist Church. Mr. Waller WHITLOCK was in charge of the music, assisted by Prof. T. R. JONES, Mrs. C. A. BLALOCK and Mrs. B. G. WARING, who sang "Beautiful Isle of Somewhere" and "Haven of Rest." Mrs. R. C. HORNE was organ accompanist. Interment was in Rocky Springs Cemetery. Active Pallbearers were: Messrs. Paul CALHOUN, J. H. CALHOUN, Wilbur CATLEDGE, Glosson SHEFFIELD, Stanton COWART, and E. A. BRONSON. Honorary Pallbearers were: Messrs. R. L. MILLINOR, J. F. LITTLETON, A. H. MORROW, W. B. DAVIS, and Ardis WARREN. Among his survivors are one sister, Mrs. Rosalie COTTINGHAM TOWNSEND and seven grandchildren and three great grandchildren.

Mrs. Ann Warren Passes Away

The Hanson community was grieved and shocked Saturday afternoon, Sept. 2, when it was learned that Mrs. Ann WARREN, "Aunt Ann", as so many called her, had passed from this earthly home to a home not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. While her death was not unexpected the grief was none the less at her going. She had been a great sufferer for the past three months. On August 3, 1938, she fell and dislocated her hip and since that time had been confined to her bed, and some weeks ago complications set in from which she could not rally. Although she was conscious almost to the very end, she talked calmly of her going as though it held no dread for

her. Her pastor often sat by her bedside and talked to her and prayed with her and she always seemed confident of her future home. She was born July 10, 1851, daughter of Thomas and Lucy STANTON, pioneer settlers of Madison county, who moved to this state from South Carolina some years earlier. On February 4, 1877, she was married to William Irvin WARREN, son of Schley and Arline WARREN, and in their union two children were born, Mrs. Etta BLAIR and Mrs. Nonie WEEKS, who survive her together with nine grandchildren and thirteen great-grandchildren. The grandchildren were too badly scattered to even attend the last rites, one in Connecticut, one in Colorado, one in Texas, one in Georgia, the remainder in Florida. She lived to the ripe old age of 88 years, one month and twenty-three days, but for several years had been unable to enjoy the beauties of nature because of blindness. Funeral was held at Pine Grove Church Sunday afternoon at four o'clock with services conducted by her pastor, Rev. L. P. DRISKELL, assisted by Rev. Harry MCDONELL and Rev. A. M. ROSE. The Rocky Springs quartet, composed of Misses Marshlea COTTINGHAM and Clare CATLEDGE and Messrs. Wesley CATLEDGE and Linton WILLIS sang "Where We'll Never Grow Old," "Rock of Ages: and "Asleep in Jesus: accompanied on the piano by Mrs. W. W. CATLEDGE. Pallbearers were Messrs. R. M. ALLEN, B. L. RAINES, W. O. RAINES, W. B. SEALS, J. E. COTTINGHAM, Phillip HOWARD, and D. H. WILLIS, Jr. with T. J. BEGGS Funeral Home in charge. The many floral offerings attested to the love and esteem in which "Aunt Ann" was held for everybody loved her. She was converted at an early age and had been a member of Rocky Springs church since girlhood and

was always loyal to her church and pastor. So at her going we mourn not as those who have no hope, but look forward to the time when we shall be united again over there. *[Extracted from the Madison Enterprise Recorder, 8 Sep 1939]*

QUERIES:

1) We are looking for some assistance in solving a bit of a mystery we have encountered. I am researching my mother's paternal line, the GAULDS of Glenbucket, Aberdeenshire Scotland. I have been corresponding with another Gauld descendant researching her Gauld's of Dundee, Scotland and we are working towards finding our common ancestor. In her line of Gaulds we have recently discovered a surprising entry. We have discovered a death registered in Cherry Lake, Madison County Florida. The following information is from the death registration that we just discovered:

Name: **John GAULD**; Death Date: 9 Nov 1935; Death Place: Cherry Lake Madison Florida; Birth Date:

3 May 1863; Birth Place: Dundee Scotland; Age at Death: 72y 6m 6d; Father's Name: Alex GAULD; Father's Birthplace: Dundee Scotland; Status: Married; Occupation: Boilermaker; Burial Place: Cherry Lake; Burial Date: 13 Nov 1935

The information we already knew:

John and his wife, Jessie, and 4 children emigrated to Quebec Canada in 1904. Two more children were born there. From the 1911 Canada Census the children were: Alexander age 26, Agnes age 24, Jane age 13, James age 9, Mary age 5 (born in Quebec), and William age 8mos (born in Quebec). John Gauld's parents were Alexander GAULD and Jane DAVIDSON of Dundee Scotland.

Alexander was also a boiler-maker. There are records of marriages taking place in Quebec for the children of John and Jessie.

We would like to confirm whether or not these John Gauld's are one and the same. If it is the same John, we wonder what brought him to Florida later in his life, are there descendants in the area, and where is he buried? Although Gauld is an uncommon name even in Scotland, they seem to be a difficult family to trace at times and have been full of surprises. My line has 3 siblings who emigrated to western Canada and were documented as being part of the Klondike and Cariboo Goldrushes. So far, we have found none who headed south though. We are hoping that somebody with knowledge and insight of Cherry Lake and Madison County may be able to help us solve the mystery of John Gauld. Thank you for any assistance and direction you are able to provide.

2) My great grandparents, **David and Ellen JONES ROBINSON** were married in Madison County, 16 Dec 1910. Ellen was born 6 Dec 1891 in Madison and died 21 Jul 1970 in Green Cove Springs, FL. David was born 10 May 1890 in Madison and died May 1966 in Green Cove Springs, FL. They both moved to Green Cove in 1914. David's parents, Pizell ROBINSON and Mary AMBROSE ROBINSON, lived in Madison. Mary is on the 1920 US Census in Green Cove showing her age as 48 years old. She was married, living with her son David & his wife, Ellen and their four kids: Pizell, David II, Martha and Bertha. Martha ROBINSON JONES was born in Madison 22 Dec 1912 and died in Green Cove Springs, 9 Jun 1985. David ROBINSON, II, shows up in Green Cove Springs on his 1918 Draft Registration card with his wife and 4 kids. It appears that Ellen ROBINSON had a sister, Retha DIXON and a brother, Howard JONES. Do not know if they lived in Madison, FL. Would seriously appreciate any further data you may be able to provide.

JOHN ELIJAH WEBB

John Elijah WEBB was born in Macon, Georgia, July 16, 1861, a son of John and Elizabeth (LAMB) WEBB. The war all but destroyed the fortunes of Mr. Webb's father and as his childhood fell during the years of that struggle and the reconstruction period, he was without many of the advantages which youths of the best families enjoyed before the war and in the modern era of prosperity. To the education supplied by the neighborhood schools he added by extensive reading. His assistance was early required on the farm and when still a very young man the entire management of the home place devolved upon him through the retirement of his father from active labor on account of ill health. In meeting the responsibilities of this situation, his first act was to sell all the mules to pay off indebtedness, and this heroic measure left him without stock to run the place. Giving his personal note for \$40.00 to a colored man in payment for a blind horse, he thus began his independent career at farming. He had his parents to support and a younger brother and sister to educate, but his industry and courage never failed to meet the responsibilities. Finally he sold his horse for \$25.00 and bought a mule for \$100.00. With \$75.00 cash he gave his note for \$40.00 for the balance.

At the age of twenty-four Mr. Webb was married to Miss Anna P. NICHOLS, who was born in Lowndes, a daughter of Thomas and Mary (VICKERS) NICHOLS. Mr. and Mrs. Webb were the parents of the following children: Mary, Elizabeth, Everett, Pearl, Vesta Van Burne, and Minnie Eugenia. Mr. Webb and his wife were members of the Methodist Church. In politics he was a Democrat and took an active part in public affairs. Four years he was a member of the county board of education and also did good service on the county board of road and revenue commissioners. He was a member of the latter when the court house was constructed, when the first definite steps were taken to straighten the county roads, and when the bridges at Troupville and over the Little river were built. These bridges were considered among the best improvements of the county.

C. C. CURRY

Mr. C. C. CURRY, a native of Washington County, Georgia, was born May 7, 1871, near Curry's old mill site in the vicinity of the Warthen Station. His father, A. G. CURRY, served in the Confederate Army during the Civil War, enlisting in a company of Georgia Volunteer Infantry, and for awhile being a prisoner-of-war. Leaving the old home farm at the age of twenty-one years, C. C. began work for himself as a bridge constructor on a railroad in Florida, for three years standing guard over a gang of convict laborers in Dutton. During that period he attended school for the first time and by night study progressed from the primer to the third reader.

Going then to Hague, FL, he found himself so far behind in his studies that he became somewhat discouraged and returned to the convict camp where he remained a year. Mr. Curry entered the National Institute at Jasper, FL. A few year later the professors there established the Georgia Normal College and Business Institute, and Mr. Curry became one of its first pupils. For three years he paid his way by janitor service and the next two years by tutoring. He won quite a reputation as a platform dialect entertainer, lecturer, elocutionist, humorist and musician, in the latter capacity being an expert banjo player. Fraternally he was a member of the Ancient Free and Accepted Order of Masons.

Mr. Curry married, at Abbeville, Georgia, Mattie DOSTER, a daughter of A. J. and Caroline DOSTER, and into their home were born four sons: Clifton, born in 1902; Olin Wimberly, born in 1904; A. J., born in 1906; and Joe Brown, born in 1908.
