Everyone was impressed with him - including his parents. Douglas greeted the guests with a handshake and a huge smile!











The Fragile X Association of Michigan will once again be granting scholarships to help our FXAM members attend the National Fragile X Foundation's biennial International Fragile X conference! We will decide the exact amount of the FXAM conference scholarships after we have the final number of scholarship applicants, but each member's scholarship will be a minimum of \$350. To apply for the FXAM conference scholarship, you need to contact Laureen Majeske at lmajeskel@comcast.net or

586-978-9079 to let her know you are interested in the scholarship. Apply to Laureen by April 30, 2014. By May 5, Laureen will confirm that you'll receive the scholarship and the amount for which you'll be eligible. In late July, you'll verify that you attended the conference by submitting receipts (hotel, etc) and, after verification, will be paid the scholarship money in early August.

Please note: The FXAM scholarship is different than the NFXF scholarship or the Rogers Neighborhood Family Fund scholarship. Both of those deadlines have passed. If you've received one of those scholarships, you may still apply for the FXAM conference scholarship.





Wrinkle Free for Fragile X!

For the 13th year, the Silverton Skin Institute of Grand Blanc, Michigan will be hosting Wrinkle Free for Fragile X and Autism. This annual event is hosted by Dr. Kimball Silverton, board certified dermatologist and fellowship trained cosmetic surgeon, and his wife Jennifer, Vice-President of the

National Fragile X Foundation Board of Directors. The event offers patients an opportunity to receive injections of a wrinkle relaxer such as botox at a significantly reduced price with all proceeds going toward research. The Silvertons have a 16-year-old son Aidan who is affected by Fragile X and a 14-year-old daughter Camryn. The event will be June 6, beginning at 9 am at the Silverton Skin Institute.
