1st Sunday of Lent (Year B) Sunday 18 February 2024 Wilderness Journey


From the sign of ashes on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday to the wooden cross of Good Friday, the forty days of Lent keep us focused on the 'Cross of Christ'. The cross overshadows our Lenten journey with Jesus from desert to Calvary. Indeed, it replicates not only the human journey but also the message of Jesus' mission that ours is a God of life and Love who never abandons His children and longs to draw all into His embrace if they would open their hearts to Him. The cross is a symbol of tragedy yet is also a doorway to resurrection - the figure of humanity's greatest hope that suffering and death do not have the last word. Through the Scriptures of these weeks, we will be reminded of the great events of Salvation history– of the triumph of new life and energy evolving out of times of deprivation, betrayal, oppression suffered by the people of God.

The first reading today recalls the ancient story of God re-establishing a covenant of love with humanity and for all creation. Out of the wilderness of a universal flood, God delivers a remnant of His faithful people with the promise that never again will such waters destroy the earth. God sets the rainbow in the rainless sky as a sign of His promise. The letter of Peter urges us to remember that through the waters of Baptism we belong to a God who is ever faithful and journeys with us even when we, like His people of old wander off course.

Following His Baptism by John and led by the Spirit Jesus began His mission journey in the wilderness – away from the securities, distractions and comforts of life – to centre Himself on the mission that God has for Him. Here, Mark' says He was tempted by "Satan" which in Hebrew means a hinderer or a stumbling block. But Jesus is not overcome by doubts about His capacity to continue. With faith in God's ongoing presence, He leaves the Wilderness firmly set on His mission.

Lent, then, is our wilderness journey. The goal of our traditional Lenten practices - "prayer, fasting and good works' is not about punishing ourselves for failings or to bargain with God – who doesn't extract punishment nor need to be bribed. Lent is about deepening our awareness of God's kingdom

amongst and within us and our mission to give witness to it. Let's make this journey a shared one: a time of being and doing, of reforming our lives and practising our new life in Christ through our interactions with others and pointing out God's rainbow of hope to the suffering, the poor and isolated amongst us.

* * * **Lenten Regulations**

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and abstinence from meat.

On all other Fridays, except solemnities, the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing any one of the following:

- (a) Prayer: e.g., Mass attendance; family prayer; a visit to a church or chapel; reading the Bible; making the Stations of the Cross; praying the Rosary; or in other ways.
- (b) Self Denial: e.g., not eating meat; not eating sweets or dessert; giving up entertainment to spend time with the family; limiting food and drink so as to give to the poor of one's own country or elsewhere; or in other ways. Project compassion is a major means of expressing our self-denial in Australia.

(c) Helping Others: e.g., special attention to someone who is poor, sick, elderly, lonely or over-burdened; or in other ways.

- All who have completed their 18th year and have not yet begun their 60th year are bound to fast. All who have completed their 14th year are bound to abstain. (Canon 1252)
- The Season of Lent is a time of penance. During Lent the faithful are exhorted to devote themselves in a special manner to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, and to deny themselves.
- Each of the faithful is obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled between Ash Wednesday, 14 February 2024 and Trinity Sunday 26 May 2024 unless for a good reason it is fulfilled at another time during the year.
- The wonderful gift of the Lord's merciful love is offered in a special way in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Lent is a most appropriate time to receive this Sacrament. All faithful who have reached the age of discretion are bound faithfully to confess their grave sins at least once a year.
