But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ (2 Pt. 3:18)

How would you rate your life in Jesus? Are you spending time with Him, getting to know Him more and more like any other relationship in your life? And as you spend time with Him, how is the Lord influencing the way you think, feel, behave, or act in life?

This coming Sunday is known as Trinity Sunday and it's meant to stimulate our faith in all three persons of the Trinity – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. But the Trinity is not an absent corporation working in our lives from some unknown international headquarters. Instead we understand God as *personal*. We talk about the fact God "knows us". And this is eternal life, that they know You the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent. (John 17:3)

Overall we are meant to know and relate with God through all three persons of the Trinity. And just like any of our other relationships in life, this requires effort and thought and time. Relationships just don't happen as much as we like to believe in spontaneity. Relationships happen because of determination.

In our ancient traditions we know God through two main factors in our weekly services – the Word and the Sacraments. God reveals Himself and we are able to know Him better. I hope as you attend St. Paul's you are purposely listening for God to reveal Himself to you each week. Especially as you come with doubts, fears, joys or excitement; God Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are there for you!

There are also private formational practices each of us can be practicing as well: How is your praying? How is your Scripture reading? How is your fellowship with others? How are your serving and good works? How is your giving? How is your meditating or reflecting? How are you listening for God in all of the above?

In order to grow in your relationship with God you have to have a plan. It should fit you and your lifestyle and way of doing things. Don't compare yourself to others. But you still need to consider your life and where you are in knowing God as He forms you into His divine nature (2 Peter 1:4) Pax

"The church council has agreed to charter a Venturing crew here at the church. In addition to expanding our community outreach and exposure, it will provide an avenue for young adults in our congregation to grow in their own faith and reverence towards God.

What is a Venturing crew? Venturing is the co-ed youth development program for young adults of the Boy Scouts of America that uses adventure with a purpose. So, yes, you read right, co-ed and Boy Scouts in the same sentence.



Venturing uses four areas of emphasis – adventure, leadership, personal growth and service – to provide fun and meaningful experiences for young adults as they provide service to the community while also pursuing their exciting and special interests that they choose to explore These activities could include backpacking, camping, rock climbing, service projects, skiing, whitewater rafting, career choices, cycling and other outdoor or indoor activities. The youth decide on their fun and excitement with the advice of adults associated with the crew.

The Venturing crew is an activity that is separate from the youth group, so being in the youth group will not automatically make you a member of the Venturing crew.

David Nelsen will be the crew's lead advisor. We need a minimum of five young adults, ages 14-20 (age 13 if graduated from 8th grade) and three adults to staff the committee in order to form the crew and file a charter.
