All AUX members in good standing (paid) are also eligible to purchase a PUFL (Paid Up For Life) membership. Never again ask yourself "Did I pay my dues?" The cost of a

PUFL membership is based on two factors - the member's age at the time of application and the dues amount of the Unit. The cost for a 60 - 69 year old AUX member (Unit yearly dues \$40) would be \$822.

If you apply before June 30, 2022 that same PUFL fee would be only \$624! Get your PUFL application in before our 2023 dues increase goes into effect. Please ask Carol for your personal rate and a PUFL application today! Please note, PUFL fees are nonrefundable.

Ways to Help Protect Yourself from Scammers

- 1. Never click on links in emails no matter how authentic they seem.
- 2. No government agency will contact you via email, text or phone. Official government contact is made only through the US postal service.
- 3. Gift cards are for gift giving. If someone asks for payment with a gift card, it's a scam! No reputable company or government agency will ask for payment with gift cards, wire transfers or cryptocurrency.
- 4. Don't help crooks by posting a lot of personal information on social media sites.
- 5. Set up all your digital accounts to require multifactor authentication.
- 6. Freeze your credit with the 3 major credit bureaus. If you plan on making a major purchase they can be unfrozen at any time.
- 7. Do not save credit card numbers online with merchants or service providers.
- 8. Always use antivirus software and perform recommended updates on all your devices.
- Because your phone number is increasingly being used for identification, remove it from as many accounts as possible. You may need to use it to open accounts but, go back and remove it later.
- 10. Scammers lure you by putting you in a heightened emotional state. The fear of losing out on a great deal; fear of being audited by the IRS; terror of losing a loved one to kidnapping, medical emergency, or incarceration; joy of finding a new love interest; YOU MUST ACT NOW! Stop, take a breath, think, and verify before acting. Better yet, just hang up!
- 11. Ignore phone calls from numbers you don't know. Let the caller leave a message, you can check later to see if the call was from a person or business you know and trust.
- Use credit cards for all online transactions. They come with protections to recover your funds if you are defrauded. Never send cash.
- 13. Add phone login protections. A survey showed that more than 25% of smartphone users did not have a barrier to keep others from using their devices. Make sure you have a passcode, facial ID or finger scan enabled on your phone.
- 14. Review your credit report. You can get a free credit report from the three agencies, Transunion, Experian and Equifax, each year. Check your report, line by line, to ensure no one has opened credit in your name and that there are no errors. Visit: AnnualCreditReport.com or call toll free: 877-322-8228.

At every official meeting of the American Legion, we honor and recognize the importance of the repatriation of the remains of POW/MIAs: Resolution 288 encourages a POW/MIA Empty Chair placed at all official meetings of The American Legion, as a physical symbol of the thousands of American POW/MIAs still unaccounted for from all wars and



conflicts involving the United States. This is a reminder for us all to spare no effort to secure the release of any American prisoners from captivity, the repatriation of the remains of those who died bravely in defense of liberty, and a full accounting of those missing. Let us rededicate ourselves for this vital endeavor!

As it stands today, there are more than 72,000 missing from World War II, more than 7,500 from the Korean War, 126 missing from the Cold War and more than 1,500 missing from the Vietnam War. We estimate almost 39,000 are recoverable, with the others being mostly deep at sea losses. Over 2,500 soldiers from Michigan from WWII alone.

WXYZ Channel 7 News reported on April 19th that the body of a World War II soldier is coming home to a Farmington Hills family. The daughter of US Pvt. Alfred R. Ricke received a call she never thought she would get in this lifetime. Maryalyce Lupher, 83 years old, was visited by a Service Officer who presented her with her father's medals, which included the Purple Heart. Her father, who went to France during World War II in 1944, is finally coming home. Read the full article here:

Membership Eligibility



<u>Legion membership eligibility</u>. Veterans or active duty military who have served at least one day of active duty in the US Armed Forces since December 7, 1941 and have been honorably discharged or are still serving. Must present a DD-214 (DD-217, DD-256, or DD-257).

<u>Auxiliary membership eligibility</u>. 1) Relationship to veteran: Grandmother, mother, sister, daughter, granddaughter, male or female spouse, or self (for female veterans).

2) Potential member must be related to a *living* veteran by one of the relationships stated **AND** veteran is a current member of the American Legion. **OR**, potential member is related to a *deceased* veteran who served at least one day of active service during eligible time periods (Apr. 6, 1917 to Nov. 11, 1918 and any time after Dec. 7, 1941) and was honorably discharged. Deceased veteran does not have to have been a member of the American Legion.

SAL membership eligibility. 1) All male descendants adopted sons, and stepsons. 2) Potential member must be related to a *living* veteran by one of the relationships stated AND veteran is a current member of the American Legion. OR, potential member is related to a *deceased* veteran who served at least one day of active service during eligible time periods (Apr. 6, 1917 to Nov. 11, 1918 and any time after Dec. 7, 1941) and was honorably discharged. Deceased veteran does not have to have been a member of the American Legion.
