Annual General Meeting

33 Ratepayers attended the Annual General Meeting held on July 2, 2016.

Administration gave a report on the 2015 audited financial statements.

A surplus of \$16,919, before amortization, was recognized in 2015.

During the year, \$731 was collected from bottle recycling and \$1,085 cash donations at Village social events.

Residents are encouraged to come forward with ideas for activities they would like to see in the Village. Also, a special thanks to Melanie Russell for taking over the flower bed at Martin Rec Center.

Residents were reminded to watch for prohibited, noxious weeds growing in the Village. Some of the weeds that are prohibited by Alberta Environment are, Oxeye Daisy, Bellflower, Creeping White Cockle and Himalayan Balsam. Thanks to Mallaig Fire Chief, Ray Brosseau, who gave a short talk at the meeting.

He talked about the 26 member volunteer Mallaig Fire Department and the service they provide to the Summer Village.

Mayor's Report

At the A.G.M. Mayor Burns gave a report on behalf of council. Following is a summary of the items covered:

- There were no major problems during the year and residents seem to be enjoying their time at the Summer Village.
- As a member of the St. Paul Regional Emergency Management Agency, the Village applied for and received approval of a \$130,000 grant to upgrade communications equipment for emergency first responders.
- ◆ The MCSNet internet tower in the Village will be increased in height to 150 ft., which should improve internet reception.
- Thanks to the volunteers who helped with this years social events.

- Due to the provincial Government updating the Municipal Government Act, the Summer Village is expecting to have to make some changes to the way it does business. These changes are not yet known.
- Residents were reminded to have consideration for their neighbors regarding noise and smoke from backyard fire pits.
- Residents were reminded about the bottle recycling barrel at the waste bin site and encouraged to use it, as it helps pay for Village functions.
- ♦ The Gazebo at the Rec Center has been moved closer to the hall, making it more useable.

****REMINDERS****

- The Village garbage bins are for bagged household garbage only. Please breakdown/crush cardboard boxes before putting them in the bin. Do not leave large items, such as appliances or furniture. The garbage truck cannot take them away, so someone from the Summer Village has to haul it to the land fill site.
- Bottle/Can Recycling: A barrel is located at the waste bin site for bottle/can recycling. The proceeds from this are used to fund community events for the residents of our Village. Your contributions are appreciated.
- Recreational Vehicles: (5th Wheels, Trailers & Motor Homes) Where more than one (1) recreational vehicle is to be place on a lot for more than twenty-one (21) consecutive days, it shall require a development permit and shall be located in a manner satisfactory to the Development Authority. Permits shall not be issued for more than one (1) recreational vehicle per developed lot or two (2) recreational vehicles per vacant lot.
