ORDINARY TIME

rdinary Time encompasses that part of the liturgical year that does not I fall within the distinctive seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. The Catholic Church celebrates two periods of the year as Ordinary Time: the first following the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and continuing until the Tuesday evening before Ash Wednesday; the second following Pentecost Sunday until the evening before Advent. There are about 33 or 34 Sundays in Ordinary Time, depending on the year. In actuality, however, there are fewer "Sundays of Ordinary Time" because major feasts honouring the Trinity, Corpus Christi, Christ the King, and others replace a particular Sunday of Ordinary Time. It is important to remember that Ordinary Time celebrates "the mystery of Christ in all its aspects". We also may celebrate the parts of Jesus' life that were ordinary, much like our own lives. *****

T n today's Gospel we hear the reassuring voice of L the Lord Jesus saying, "Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me . . . and you will find rest for your souls. For my voke is easy, and my burden is light". As we strive to live as good Christian people, we find for my yoke is that we are not alone. By accepting Christ's yoke, by stepping into the voke that he already shoulders. means to allow Christ to stand in the voke alongside



us, to allow him to shoulder the greater part of whatever burden we may be carrying. Christ's yoke is easy because, at the heart of Christian discipleship, we find not a law, but a person, a person who is "meek and humble of heart", a person who loves us and shoulders our load. By turning to the Lord in prayer, we find comfort and strength, and realize the importance of cooperating with grace in our lives.

nedict decided on a life of solitude at a young age. He \mathbf{D} received the monastic habit and retired to a cave, where he lived alone in the tradition of the Desert Fathers. Soon he attracted followers and he built 12 small monasteries for those who wished to share his life. Later he and a few companions founded the great monastery of Monte Cassino where Benedict spent the rest of his life and wrote his *Rule* which is still followed today by the

Benedictines. The *Rule* emphasizes moderation, humility, obedience, prayer and manual labour as the way to holiness. Saint Benedict is considered the Patriarch of Western Monasticism and is Patron of Europe.

HEARING ASSISTIVE TECHNLOGY

C t Joseph's Church has an FM System installed which will allow those with hearing challenges to \mathcal{O} use the system in order to improve their ability to hear the readings and prayers.

In order to use the system, you will need to obtain an FM receiver and either a headset or hearing loop from the Hospitality Ministry, when you enter the church. As we have limited numbers they will be issued on a first come basis.

To use the headset, plug it into the receiver and adjust the volume to a comfortable level.

To be able to use the hearing loop, you must have hearing aids that have a T-coil, and it needs to be activated by your hearing care professional if it is not. To determine whether you have T-coil or not, the model number for the hearing aids that have a T-coil installed will end with a T.

The units must be returned immediately following the liturgy.


