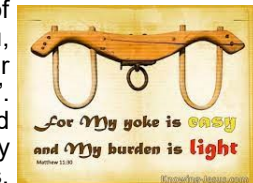

**ORDINARY TIME**

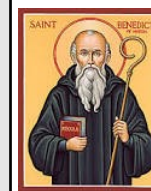
Ordinary Time encompasses that part of the liturgical year that does not fall within the distinctive seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. The Catholic Church celebrates two periods of the year as Ordinary Time: the first following the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and continuing until the Tuesday evening before Ash Wednesday; the second following Pentecost Sunday until the evening before Advent. There are about 33 or 34 Sundays in Ordinary Time, depending on the year. In actuality, however, there are fewer "Sundays of Ordinary Time" because major feasts honouring the Trinity, Corpus Christi, Christ the King, and others replace a particular Sunday of Ordinary Time. It is important to remember that Ordinary Time celebrates "the mystery of Christ in all its aspects". We also may celebrate the parts of Jesus' life that were ordinary, much like our own lives.

In today's Gospel we hear the reassuring voice of the Lord Jesus saying, "Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me . . . and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light". As we strive to live as good Christian people, we find that we are not alone. By accepting Christ's yoke, by stepping into the yoke that he already shoulders, means to allow Christ to stand in the yoke alongside us, to allow him to shoulder the greater part of whatever burden we may be carrying. Christ's yoke is easy because, at the heart of Christian discipleship, we find not a law, but a person, a person who is "meek and humble of heart", a person who loves us and shoulders our load. By turning to the Lord in prayer, we find comfort and strength, and realize the importance of cooperating with grace in our lives.



**JULY 11 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT BENEDICT, ABBOT**



Benedict decided on a life of solitude at a young age. He received the monastic habit and retired to a cave, where he lived alone in the tradition of the Desert Fathers. Soon he attracted followers and he built 12 small monasteries for those who wished to share his life. Later he and a few companions founded the great monastery of Monte Cassino where Benedict spent the rest of his life and wrote his *Rule* which is still followed today by the Benedictines. The *Rule* emphasizes moderation, humility, obedience, prayer and manual labour as the way to holiness. Saint Benedict is considered the Patriarch of Western Monasticism and is Patron of Europe.

**BAPTISM STIPEND - \$25.00** - Baptisms are celebrated by appointment (after a Baptism Preparation Course has been completed).

**BAPTISM PREPARATION:** The baptism of a child is a very important event in the life of the child, the child's family, and the parish community. To help parents enter more fully into the celebration of their child's baptism, St. Joseph's Parish offers a Baptism Preparation Course by appointment. Parents along with godparents are expected to attend the Baptism Preparation Course before the baptism of the child. Please call the Parish Office to register.

**MARRIAGE STIPEND - \$200.00** - Please allow at least six months between the time of contacting the Parish and the date of the Marriage. A Marriage Preparation Course is required.

 The 2022-2023 **Living with Christ Sunday Missal** is available at the Parish Office for \$5.00 each. This missal helps Catholics prepare for and participate in the Sunday Eucharistic Liturgy. It is also useful for personal devotion. The Sunday Missal contains complete readings and Mass texts, as well as selected hymns for Sundays and feast days for the entire Church year.

## HEARING ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY

St Joseph's Church has an FM System installed which will allow those with hearing challenges to use the system in order to improve their ability to hear the readings and prayers.

In order to use the system, you will need to obtain an FM receiver and either a headset or hearing loop from the Hospitality Ministry, when you enter the church. As we have limited numbers they will be issued on a first come basis.

**To use the headset**, plug it into the receiver and adjust the volume to a comfortable level.

**To be able to use the hearing loop**, you must have hearing aids that have a T-coil, and it needs to be activated by your hearing care professional if it is not. To determine whether you have T-coil or not, the model number for the hearing aids that have a T-coil installed will end with a T.

The units must be returned immediately following the liturgy.

**July 13 - Memorial of Saint Henry:** Known as Henry the Good, Henry II (972-1024) was renowned as a just and clement ruler, a man of prayer, and a humble ascetic. He was canonized in 1146 by Pope Eugene III and is a patron of Benedictine oblates, childless people, dukes, kings, and the physically challenged.

**July 14 - Memorial of Saint Camillus de Lellis, Priest:** Camillus found his vocation in caring for the sick. Due to the horrific conditions in hospitals in the 16<sup>th</sup> century, he resolved to establish an order to care for the sick and dying. He was ordained and founded the nursing congregation of the Ministers of the Sick, the Camillians.. He was canonized in 1746 and is a patron saint of nurses and of the sick.

**July 15 - Memorial of Saint Bonaventure, Bishop, Doctor:** Born in Tuscany in 1221, Bonaventure joined the Friars Minor at age 20 and was sent to the University of Paris where he studied and then taught the philosophy and theology of the Franciscan school. In 1257 he was chosen minister general of the Franciscan Order and in 1273 he was appointed a cardinal by Pope Gregory X. He was known for his holiness, humility and virtue, and the dedication of his intellectual gifts to the service of the Church. In 1482 he was canonized, and in 1588 he was declared a Doctor of the Church. His many writings still inspire readers of today.
