#### Why

- ▶ 180,000 Veterans in Southwest Ohio
  - ▶ 9% of population compared to US rate of 5%
- Approximately 50% of Veterans are Vietnam era and older
- Other 50% is Post 911
- Approximately 20% of Vets have Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)
- Approximately 20% of Vets have Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI)

Vets with TBI or PTSD have a 60% increased risk of developing Dementia.




# Addressing Title 5 Care: Clergy Summit Initiative

- > Initiated due to a high incidence of civilian suicides at base
- ➤ No Civilian Comprehensive Airman Fitness spiritual pillar
- > Chaplain Corps prohibited by statute from providing care
- > Effort to build resources with off-base faith communities
  - Licensed Faith-based Counselors
  - Additional resiliency resources
- > First Clergy summit held February 2015
  - 63 clergy attended from 50 mile radius of Robins
  - Formation of Robins Ministerial Alliance
- > Second Annual Clergy Summit held March 2016
  - 96 clergy attending
  - > Third Annual Clergy Summit held March 2017
    - 120 clergy attending





## Excused Absence for Crisis Spiritual Care

- ➤ Launched 1 August 2016
- Administrative Leave for Civilians to seek spiritual care in a personal crisis
- Allows 1.5 hours to meet with clergy/spiritual care provider of choice
- > For CRISES only intent to stem suicidal / self-destructive behavior
- ➤ Face-to-Face Resource
- > AFGE Local 987 RMA Partnership
  - On-Call Clergy Team available M-F, 0700-1900



# Excused Absence for Crisis Spiritual Care

### RMA-AFGE 987 Crisis On-Call Civilian Clergy Supervisory Step-By-Step Guide

For civilian employees experiencing a **CRISIS** (not routine counseling)

- 1. On-Call Civilian Clergy Team available M-F 0700-1900
- Call 478-352-1190 and request on-call clergy (allow minimum 30 minute response time)\*
- 3. Allow <u>1.5 hours total</u> for counseling session & movement to/from counseling location
- Employee may choose to utilize personal clergy member vs. Union program (see #3)
- 5. On-call clergy counseling occurs at Base Chapel (Bldg 769)
- Request member provide proof of appointment upon return (signed note of kept appointment)
- 7. Code in Leave system as LN, subcode PF

\*Note: If the Clergy Cell is busy or no one answers, contact the base chapel (DSN 468-2821; Comm 478-926-2821) and ask for the chapel staff member to contact the on-call clergy responder (before 0730 and after 1630, call the CP and ask for the duty chaplain – DSN 497-2612, Comm 478-327-2612)

# Directions for AFCP SharePoint Account

#### **How to Register:**

The process of establishing an account consists of two steps:

- 1. Create an APAN account:
  - To register for an account, go to https://wss.apan.org/s/airforcepartnerships
  - In the upper right hand corner of the site, click the green "Create an Account" button
  - Enter your e-mail address as requested
  - A validation e-mail will be sent to you from APAN Support. Follow the instructions provided in the e-mail to set up your account



Hosted on All Partners Access Network (APAN), a web-based, non .mil collaboration platform developed to foster information and knowledge sharing between DOD and non-DOD entities

- 2. Register on the site as a user:
  - After you have set up your account, log back into APAN( https://apan.org/). Cut and paste the link into your browser (https://wss.apan.org/s/airforcepartnerships) and hit Enter to go to the SharePoint site
  - Register under First Time Users on the main page to be added as a user. Until you request access, you will only have limited access to content on the Welcome page. You will receive access within one business day
