It is the season of Lent. Our Ash Wednesday worship service was on Wednesday, February 26. Ash Wednesday reminds us of our humanness, realizing that we do not know what the future brings for any of us. On Ash Wednesday, we received the sign of ashes which marks our frailty. We are dust, and we will return to dust.

Sunday, March 1st, is the 1st Sunday in Lent with Communion. During this Season of Lent, I encourage each of you to remember the meaning of Lent. It is the time we acknowledge our need for repentance and for the mercy and forgiveness of Jesus Christ.

ELECTRONIC DONATIONS TO CPC

Since the founding of the church, members and friends have placed their tithes in the collection plate on Sundays. That will not change, but we are adding new opportunities for giving. The picdisplayed shows ture "Donation new our



Station" for the narthex. This is an iPad tablet with a credit/debit card reader. On Sundays after worship, it will be set

up during the coffee hour. Thus, you will be able to select your contribution amount, where you want it targeted (General Giving, Mission, etc.), and with a swipe or inserting of a chip, you can use your card to contribute. You can quickly and easily gift without fumbling for a check or filling out an envelope for a cash donation.

The donation is cleared through PayPal. You can get an instant receipt sent to your e-mail, and our Treasurer will also receive an electronic record to add your gift towards your annual contribution report. A \$0.30 fee as well as a 2.7% clearing expense will be charged to CPC for each transaction.

The advantages of this additional platform are obvious. Many younger members rarely carry cash or use checks. Plus, the funds are transferred to CPC electronically, not requiring a check endorsement or the filing of a deposit slip with our bank.

You may also have noticed a new tab on our website. The "Donation" tab can now be found on the selection menu of our website on the far right side of the page. Once you select it, you will be able to donate a specific amount to a selected fund utilizing your credit/debit card or via your PayPal account (should you have one). The cost to CPC here is \$0.30 fee with a 2.2% clearing expense per transaction. This too allows you to receive an electronic receipt, and our Treasurer will be able to track your gift.

Bringing your tithe to church will not change. It will still be a personal decision between you and God. Yet, the ways by which you bring your tithe are expanding. A century ago people brought livestock and crops to the fall harvest celebration. Today you can bring your gift in dollars, check, automatic checking account withdrawal, credit/debit card, or via PayPal. It all goes to the mission of the church, regardless of method.
