- The Greater Washington Immigration FilmFest began in 2012 as a member activity of The Washington Ethical Society in Washington D.C. It has expanded to encompass dozens of partner communities, congregations and colleges across the region. Co-founders, Patti Absher and Judith Johnson volunteer their private sector management and marketing expertise to produce an annual filmfest and educational program that reaches immigrants and neighbors in their communities in the DC region covering Arlington, Fairfax, Prince George's and Montgomery counties, and Cities of Alexandria and Washington DC. The Immigration FilmFest also reaches national and international policy shapers around the Nation's capitol. It is the only FilmFest focused solely on immigrants and immigration in the United States today. www.immigrationfilmfest.org
- We are an all-volunteer, non-profit event managed and led by a executive committee and steering committee composed of FilmFest founders and host partners. A crew of more than 50 volunteers, directed by volunteer team leaders, organize and stage the Immigration FilmFest programs and screenings, review and select films, raise funds, prepare reports, and promote the filmfest with diverse audiences.
