Welcome to the Summer Term


We are very happy to see all the children back at school today, and are looking forward to a summer term where children are playing and learning in a safe and stimulating environment.

Be prepared for the sun

On sunny days please remember to put suncream on your child before they come to nursery. We will top up for the children who attend all day (you will already have given permission for this when your child started). If your child needs an alternative cream please make sure we have some at nursery.

Please dress your child appropriately. They will need sunhats (write their names in them) and should wear clothes that are light but that cover their shoulders. Footwear must be suitable for climbing, running etc so they need to be fastened securely on their feet. (no flipflops)

Backpacks and Water Bottles

To support the end of day dismissal it would be helpful if children kept their bag of clothes at nursery unless we have had to change their clothes (instead of taking it home every day). They will bring home their water bottle on a daily basis for washing and refilling.

Recipe of the Month

We will be sharing simple and healthy recipes in our monthly newsletters. Here is the first one.

Stuffed Pitta

Stuffed Pittas are a great nutritional lunch/snack and they are easy to make with children. Children at tea club enjoy making these for their tea. At Moss Hall Nursery School children use real knives (supervised).



What you need;

- Wholemeal or White Pitta Breads

Suggested Fillings: cheese, chicken and sweetcorn, tuna mayo, chickpeas, scrambled eggs

Salad: cucumber, grated carrot, sliced peppers, shredded lettuce

- 1.Cut the pitta breads in half and carefully cut open the top of the pitta. You will then have a pitta pocket.
- 2. You can then get the children to fill them up with their favourite toppings.
- 3. Now they are ready to eat.
