Program Overview

- Experience of a lifetime for active duty military, post-9/11 veterans, reservists, and guard members. Other young adults and military spouses/dependents accepted on space available basis
- No prior experience required, great preparation regardless of career interest
- Significant repair projects on National Historic Landmark Structures and Monuments
- Led by CPI's expert staff and National Park Service (NPS) & industry guest lectures
- · Three 12-week, full-time sessions each year at each location
- No program fees for military affiliated individuals; fees may apply for others (please see CPI website or call for fee information for specific sessions)
- CPI is an official US Army Career Skills Program (open to individuals from any service branch) and partners with the US National Park Service

Employment Outlook

CPI participants, with or without college degrees, gain excellent career opportunities in many areas within and outside of the concrete/construction industries including project management, business development, sales, marketing, engineering and design, skilled trades, artistic and specialty concrete, equipment mechanic and operation, lab/site material quality control/testing, truck driving, etc. Top industry executives routinely visit our project sites to interview participants. We have a strong placement rate for our alumni actively seeking employment in many areas across the United States.

Participants

- Earn 480 National Park Service volunteer hours (in addition to any scholarship or stipend that may by offered)
- Complete OSHA course and receive OSHA Safety Certificate
- Gain or prepare for concrete Industry professional certifications (see below)
- Gain teamwork skills and a tremendous sense of **accomplishment** completing significant real-world projects
- Gain leadership experience through project & logistics management, safety management, and public relations
- · Develop hands-on skills in basic concrete construction/repair design, evaluation, and testing; project scheduling/estimating; tool/equipment operation and maintenance; wood carpentry; and concrete materials/mixing/placement/finishing
- Become knowledgeable about preservation and long-term stewardship of natural resources and the built environment
- · Interact often with industry executives to learn and interview for jobs or internships
- · Participate in field trips to local project sites, manufacturing facilities, and business locations
- Give back by serving as mentors for local youth during CPI's community service activities
- Join the growing CPI alumni network across the US

Alcatraz Island Program Specifics

- Housing and local transportation provided; monthly stipend may be offered (see website or call for possible stipend information)

Pearl Harbor Program Specifics

- Participants are active duty military as part of CPI's official US Army Career Skills Program (all military branches may participate)
