Their important mission is to provide homeless individuals and families with the transitional resources and opportunities to attain residential, financial, personal stability and self-sufficiency. To support this mission the FKOC has housing available for up to 70 single men at four facilities. Additionally, there are case management facilities for single women, with or without children which can handle up to 52 women and children. The Peacock House supports homeless adults with serious mental illness.
