

# Thoughts on...Stewardship By Dianne Nichols

Tis the Season for Giving....

Did you know that in the U.S. this Christmas season, spending on gifts is expected to exceed \$781 Billion? And that most parents spend \$271 per child on gifts? One in 10 parents spend over \$500 per child.

In Mississippi, the average MONTHLY income is \$1,722.50. In Uganda, the average ANNUAL income was \$510 in 2013. In Somalia, the average ANNUAL income was \$150.

Jesus was poor. He was born in a stable. His earthly father was a carpenter. He told a teacher of the law, "Foxes have holes and birds of the airs have nests, but the Son of Man has no place to lay His head." (Matt. 8: 19-20)

In the book of Deuteronomy, Chap. 15, the LORD tells the Israelites "If there is a poor man among your brothers in any of the towns that the LORD your God is giving you, do not be hardhearted or tightfisted toward your poor brother. Rather be openhanded and freely lend him whatever he needs. (v. 7-8) Give generously to him and do so without a grudging heart; then because of this the LORD your God will bless you in all your work and in everything you put your hand to.

There will always be poor people in the land. Therefore I command you to be openhanded toward your brothers and toward the poor and needy in your land." (v. 10-11)

On Christmas, God gave us His only Son. On Good Friday, Jesus gave His life so that ours would be redeemed. We can never "Out Give" God.....

But maybe we can give a little less to those who have much — and give a little more to those who have little this Holiday Season.

## Mission Building Update

As many of you may had heard from our November voters meeting, the mission building committee is offering an intermediate step to expand our outreach to the community. We are proposing to purchase two modular buildings for use as a large meeting room and classrooms. The proposed site would be between the cemetery and pole barn as shown on the Google map.

Just because we are taking this path doesn't mean that plans for a new building over. This is an intermediate step, because the need to expand St. Paul's Christian education and outreach is upon us now. The small chapel is no longer sufficient. Just one of these modular buildings is almost twice the space of the chapel. Two modular buildings is nearly equivalent to one level of the new building that we have been considering for over a year.

At this time, we are not financially healthy enough to take on a new mortgage payment (almost \$2,000/month). There is sufficient money in the building fund to pay in full for this intermediate step without the burden of a huge mortgage. We also want to make sure that there some building funds leftover to help out with the new building or renovations for the current building.

Towards the end of December, you can expect to receive a notice in the mail from St. Paul's Lutheran Church for a special voter's meeting in mid-January. The purpose is to go over the proposal and vote on the various options for the new mission buildings. The ground will also be staked out for new buildings.

Overall we are looking at \$40,000-\$50,000 for the basic set up and ready for use cost. This is the most important part to give us two large open buildings with one restroom. The work will be performed by a combination of paid contractors and volunteered contractor talents our in congregation. This is to give a quick turnaround to passed inspection and allow immediate use of the spaces. Such activities include setting up the buildings on footings, electrical, water and septic service, installing one restroom, decking, and skirting.

We did get one piece of good news from the county. We can use the existing septic line that is servicing the chapel. This saves us the expense of a new septic system (\$22,000-\$30,000).

Below are some options that the congregation will need to consider approving or committing to donate. Keep in mind that we need to divide one of the buildings into classrooms and make both of them new and welcoming in our outreach with the local community.

- · Re-siding the exterior of the buildings.
- New carpeting.
- Walls to divide one of the buildings into four to six classrooms.
- Second restroom (most likely needed if we want to consider something like after daycare).
- Coffee Mess in the large meeting building.
- Demolition of chapel and paving new parking spaces.

Feel free to talk with me and the other building committee members. Please pray and consider supporting this effort in the upcoming special voter's meeting in January.

Dear Lord, Continue to fill us with the spirit of love and peace toward one another. Help us in extending Your kingdom so that Your salvation reaches every soul in southern Maryland. Amen..






