Reviews by Jessica Hesselgrave of Salem South Lyon Library

Wicked City by Beatriz Williams

Ella Gilbert leaves her SoHo loft and cheating husband for a quaint Greenwich Village building that housed one of New York City's most notorious speakeasies – The Christopher Club – during the Roaring Twenties. When she moves in, her musician neighbor, Hector, warns her to stay out of the basement after midnight. Despite being empty for decades, the basement comes alive after midnight with a cacophony of noises – clinking glasses, jazz, laughter, the occasional scream – and as Ella unravels the history of the building, she finds a link between her own family and a quick-witted flapper that used to frequent the speakeasy.

Hillbilly Elegy: A Memoir of a Family and a Culture in Crisis by J.D. Vance

Told through personal family memoir, this book shows the decline of working-class white Americans, a group that has been disintegrating steadily over the past forty years. Told through the story of the Vance family, beginning in postwar America with the author's grandparents, who were 'dirt poor and in love', and their journey from the Kentucky's Appalachia to Ohio in the hopes of escaping the poverty of their birthplace. The struggles that the family faced from going from impoverished to middle-class is reflected in this book, showing that the demons of a chaotic family history can haunt for generations to come.

For a Healthy Heart--Take Control of Blood Pressure

Over 75 million American adults have high blood pressure (hypertension) – that’s 1 in every 3 adults! Hypertension, also known as the “silent killer,” often has no warning signs or symptoms. As common as hypertension is, how much do *you* really know about this condition? Did you know:

- Your blood pressure measures how hard your blood is pressing against your arteries.
 - The systolic (top) number measures this pressure when your heart is *pumping*.
 - The diastolic (bottom) number measures this pressure when your heart is *resting*.
- Factors that can cause high blood pressure that are uncontrollable:
 - Age
 - Certain diseases (kidney or thyroid)
 - Heredity
- Factors that can cause high blood pressure that are controllable:
 - How much you weigh
 - How much alcohol you drink
 - Salt intake
 - Caffeine intake

- A “normal” blood pressure for most adults is less than 120 / 80 mmHg
- For most adults, blood pressure that is being *treated* should be less than 140 / 90 mmHg
- Many medications are available to treat hypertension, such as:
 - Diuretics (Hydrochlorothiazide, Furosemide, Bumetanide)
 - ACE inhibitors (Lisinopril, Enalapril)
 - Beta blockers (Atenolol, Metoprolol, Carvedilol)
 - Calcium channel blockers (Amlodipine, Diltiazem)
- Many pharmacies now offer free blood pressure testing without an appointment. Stop into your pharmacy today for a blood pressure checkup.

Easy Baked Chicken Dinner

Peel & large cube 3 or 4 sweet potatoes

6 or 8 Chicken wings

1 Broccoli Crown or head cut and separated

1/3 cup olive oil

1 tsp Oregano

1 tsp Garlic Powder or Garlic Seasoned Salt

Place in a plastic bag with 1/3 c. Olive oil and shake well to coat.

In a second plastic bag add Oregano, Garlic Powder or Garlic Seasoned Salt.

Put in oil coated potatoes, chicken and broccoli. Shake well.

Spray cookie sheet lightly. Spread ingredients evenly. Place in pre-heated oven 375 or 400 degrees.

Bake until fork tender. Amounts on above can be adjusted.

Birdfeeders--Keep 'em Filled and Clean

Feed birds only in the winter, when they can't find food, and bring in your feeder when springtime comes, right? I used to think so, but now I know better!

Why should we feed birds year-round?

I posed this question to Laurel Zoet, who, along with her husband Mitch, are opening a new Wild Birds Unlimited store in the Green Oaks Village Place, at I-23 and Lee Road. The store is located between the TJ Maxx and Justice stores.

I first met Laurel, who calls herself a "bird nerd," several years ago, when she worked as an interpreter at Kensington Metropark. Naturalists, or interpreters, connect people to important natural, cultural and historical resources in the outdoor world.

Laurel cited a study conducted by Milliken University in Illinois, which showed birds that have access to supplemental feeding have better body conditioning and reduced physiological stress.

Birds have higher energy needs year-round, compared to humans or mammals. Their average body temperature is 104 to 107 °F, and they have a very fast metabolism. Birds have to eat a lot each day just to survive. "Eats like a bird" may be true for them, but it is a bad idea for us!

As winter wanes and the temperatures warm up, bird migration season begins, with birds flying great distances, as far away as South America, up to Michigan and beyond. Then comes nesting season. In addition to building a nest and laying eggs, birds must find food to survive and

maintain that high body temperature and fast metabolism. Once the eggs hatch, birds must have the energy to provide for their young, in addition to themselves. Next come the physical demands of molting, which poses incredible demands on those little bird bodies, according to Laurel. "Each bird has to lose and then regenerate thousands of feathers. The study showed that birds grew higher quality feathers, when food was supplied. This helps them get ready for their migration south." And many of the birds that stay here year-round like to "cache" or store extra seed in nooks and crannies within tree bark.

So, keep your birdfeeder out all year, and offer high-quality birdseed. And please keep your feeding station clean – that is really important. Laurel makes the analogy of sharing one juice cup among a group of kids. Clean and sanitize your birdfeeder every four to six weeks to make the food attractive and to help stop the spread of diseases among your feathered friends.

In addition to selling all sorts of bird seed and bird feeders, the new Wild Birds Unlimited store will offer bird feeder washing and repair services, as well as bird feeder cleaning supplies. They are happy to look at any bird feeder to see if they can repair it. Some of the new bird feeders at the store are made with silver ions which inhibits the growth of bacteria and mold.

In addition to selling products, they will also be offering bird walks for beginners on nearby trails with access to Island Lake State Recreation Area. "We want to help people learn how to use a field guide and learn basic bird biology," says Laurel.

Finally, after a 4 1/2 year delay, on February 3, 2017, the Oakland County Health Department came to the Clubhouse to complete an inspection for our Certification to provide Meals on Wheels luncheons. Three areas of concern were noted:

- 1 Self Closing Devices had to be installed on the restroom doors.
2. The Hostess had to complete an Online Allergen Training course-take and pass the test.
3. Meals on Wheels staff needed to prepare some procedural documentation appropriate for our site

Once again John McGraw came to our rescue and has installed Self Closing Door devices. I have completed the course and test requirement. Meals and Wheels staff (at the time of this writing) are finalizing the procedural documentation and Senior Dining will resume the Tuesday and Thursday luncheons starting Tuesday March 7, 2017. 


