FAITH FORMATION





Greetings to each of you in the Houghs Neck community. My wife Jean (also a pastor) and I both look forward to getting acquainted with as many of you as possible. I am returning to the pastorate after a fifteen year hiatus during which I taught science in public schools: biology for three years in Seattle; physics and astronomy for twelve years at Newton South High School, Newton, Mass. I've known parents of my students to get the jitters coming back into a high school for Parent Night mostly because their memories of the experience are none too fond. I can relate. I was a Johnny-come-lately when it came to academics. Except for sports, my high school days in the classroom were nothing to write home about. And don't let the pastor thing scare you. As Father Martin will attest, clergy-types don't bite. So let's dare to get to know each other, maybe share a laugh or two, perhaps even a tear. All of us, whether inside the church or outside, Catholic, Protestant, Muslim, Jew, Buddhist, Hindu... whatever connects you to something greater than yourself, all of us have stories to share about our journeys that have brought us to this time and place. But my hope is that my checkered experience will afford us opportunities to connect on many levels and in a variety of ways whether it be in conversations about science, religion, or what it means to be a person of faith. Or, if none of that floats your boat (the Neck has already got a hold on me!), but you're a sports fan, be it football, basketball, baseball, track (I did them all in high school and played football a little bit at the college level), let's talk Sox, Celtics, Pats...

Life is a great adventure! I look forward to sharing it with you here in Houghs Neck. I still have lots to learn. I'm confident we have much to teach each other. Believers, unbelievers, or questioning believers, to me, we are all children of a loving God, the God of all creation.

Dear Houghs Neck Residents,

National The Council of State Legislators Summit was an incredible success. Over 6,300 state legislators visited Massachusetts to attend the four day conference. It was the largest number of attendees since 2007, which was the last time Massachusetts hosted the event. The conference was privately paid for and no state or municipal tax dollars were used. Beyond state legislators attending, there were dozens of consul generals, ambassadors, Chief Executive Officers of international and local companies, and a variety of experts in public policy. In all, there were over 800 possible seminars and lectures that attendees could partake in, as well as site visits to our different industry headquarters and historical landmarks. It was a great week of showcasing Massachusetts.

During the summit, I was invited to speak to a legislative delegation from the province of Quebec regarding Massachusetts' marijuana bill that was signed into law this month. The Canadian government legalized recreational marijuana and established a regulatory structure to oversee the new industry on a federal level. Additionally, each province became responsible for implementing their own licensing and regulatory standards on the local level. They can establish their own laws tightening the sale of recreational marijuana, but must remain in compliance with federal law. In the United States,

federal law prohibits the use and sale of marijuana; however, 26 states and the District of Columbia have implemented recreational and/or medical marijuana laws through legislation or through ballot questions. The legal theory that the states are operating under is that as long as no marijuana is sold out of state, it does not trigger federal jurisdiction under the United States Constitution's interstate commerce clause. But, this has not been tested in federal court, and we are waiting to see if this will happen.

Since assuming the role as Chair of the Joint Committee on Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure, my meeting schedule has increased significantly. I have been meeting with representatives from industries impacted by illegal representation of patent ownership and reading the latest Supreme Judicial Court's decisions on alcohol minimum pricing. I continue to have a very active schedule of meetings, conference calls, hosting visitors ranging from students to foreign dignitaries, while at the same time attending as many events in Quincy as possible. I am fortunate to have exceptional staff who "keep me on track". They ensure that I do not miss any details, whether it is constituent work or reviewing legislation in my committee. As always, I encourage people to reach out to my office with questions or concerns.



It's sad to see summer winding down. My boat has been in the driveway much of the summer which is always disappointing. That hasn't kept me out of the water though. We've had a great time swimming and floating along Rock Island Road. The new public floats were installed at Bayswater/Perry Beach and I'm hearing that the kids have enjoyed them at high tide and the boaters are appreciating the amenity for the ramp. While these were installed for this season, we will bring them back this year and still have some funds remaining from the Community Preservation Grant we received for this project. I welcome your feedback as to how things can be better improved for recreation in this area. Neighbors have also been asking what we can do to improve passive recreation at Chapel Park, and I welcome your input in regards. We also received Community Preservation Funding for the next phase of the Manet Lake project. We are working with a new environmental engineering firm; Lucas Environmental, who are based out of Quincy. I have a site meeting with them this week and will be learning more about how we can improve the ecology of this area as it's overgrown with invasive phragmite. There's opportunity for storm water management improvements for this watershed area and anything we can do on that front helps this neighborhood. Winthrop Street recently had its water main and gas main replaced. The utility trenches have been paved and time is needed for them to settle before the road is paved. The new DPW Commissioner and Mayor's Office have assured me that paving is scheduled for this construction season; so we don't have to endure the deteriorating road conditions this winter. Nut Island Ave is a small street that was recently paved and the crew's next project along Rhoda Street is much larger. I don't have the mobilization info yet but neighbors should expect to receive a letter from DPW soon and I will include the info in my e-newsletter and social media when received. I recently held a community meeting that covered many topics of interest in Houghs Neck. We talked about the designs for Grenham Playground/Macy Park and it's new play equipment and coastal landscaping. The Quincy Police Department Community Police Unit gave an update and answered questions.

Real time data is listed on the police page of the city's website and it shows that our area is pretty quiet. We do need residents to contact Quincy Police if they see something concerning so they can respond. The highlight of the evening was the unveiling of the plans for the Houghs Neck Maritime & Community Center. I welcome you to visit my website MargaretLaforest.com as I have loaded the slides from the presentation and the narrative to go along. We presented a draft proposal of the overall site plan. This maintains the Public Landing in its current location (a new structure will need to be designed and built as the current structure is deteriorating and we've already bandaided as much as we can), the boat ramp gets located at the lowest end of the parcel, closest to Quincy Yacht Club with boat floats on the side closer to the Public Landing. The relocation of the boat ramp is a major change. After the City of Quincy filed the permit application for this project and FEMA changed the flood maps which has sent us back to the drawing board. When the costs of a project exceed 50% of the value of the structure, the owner is required to make the structure FEMA compliant. While our original intention was to leave the major elements in their existing locations, the flood map changed and we had an opportunity to correct some of the challenges we were concerned about; pedestrian flow to the building and waterfront and separating the swimmers from the boaters. This new design pulls the walkways away from the boat ramp, and when the old ramp is removed, the project will rebuild the beach in the area and people can swim from shore. We are also incorporating a "salt water pool". This isn't a "pool" but rather when you align four floats in a square pattern, you create a safe swimming area in the middle. We envision doing this at the end of the public landing. The design of the public landing and associated floats will be further in the process. Please note, the salt water pool as it is laid out here is much longer than what we envision. For a point of reference, Wessagusset Yacht Club has this feature on their docks. The space is being designed to improve public access to the waterfront. Much of Quincy's 27 miles of coastline is privately owned. Generations of families have enjoyed jumping the Public Landing and

this tradition to continue and it is the reason I've dedicated so much of my time to this project. I have great memories of going to Hurley's with my dad, stepping the mast of his sailboat, seeing the skiffs full of flounder arrive, and having conversation with neighbors. We welcome your ideas as to what you'd like to see here. Houghs Neck is a neighborhood full of pride and us NECKA'S love our history. We asked the project team to review old photographs to get an understanding of the historic architecture of the area and to design a building that would pay homage to past generations. A dominant architectural feature of the time is the wrap-around porch and we wanted to incorporate that feature into the design. Quincy Yacht Club was founded in 1874 and has always been an icon of our waterfront. We wanted the design of the Maritime Center to compliment the club. The Great Hill Observatory used to be located atop Great Hill in Houghs Neck and was used for residents and visitors to enjoy the scenic views. You can see in this old image, people playing lawn tennis. These images were the inspiration for the design. While it is evident the views of the bay from the Maritime Center property, we wondered how high we'd need to get to see views of the Boston Skyline. If you stand on the Maritime Center property and look across towards Brill Field, we believe at 30' you'll be able to see the Boston skyline. While the image of the observatory/lighthouse design may look looming, the structure will be 2 1/2 stories, the equivalent of a single family home. The first floor will be dedicated to the Houghs Neck Community Council and Houghs Neck Community Center. Public bathrooms, available for boaters use, will be accessible off the lobby. The "Gallery" area is being designed to showcase historic images and memorabilia of Houghs Neck. The Community Center Director will have an office. The kitchen and storage areas are accessible from the inside and outside for ease of loading/unloading during events. The Community Room has capacity for 100 people and there's an exterior deck for community use. All of the activities that currently occur in the Community Room at 1193 Sea Street will be relocated to the first floor of this building and the Community Council and Community Center will also have use of the upper floors. The second floor is designed to meet the needs of the boating community. Uses of this space will be similar to what occurs at the Maritime Center today. Currently,

swimming from the docks. We want

the meeting room of the Maritime Center holds less than 50 people. The Quincy Police Marine Unit use this room for boating safety classes. In 2016, they taught more boaters than other community in the any Commonwealth. The Marine Unit uses this space for tranining, I use the space for community meetings, and we share use of this room with many organizations including the Girl Scouts and the Quincy Animal Shelter. We consistently hear that the room is too small and the capacity has been designed to accommodate 100 people. We were very cognizant of designing a space reflective of coastal use and because we wanted to reduce the building size, each level is "stepped back". There's a large deck on this level that will have public use, when the meeting room is not in use. The public will be able to go up to the observatory to enjoy views of the Boston skyline. The existing maritime center has two offices for the Harbormaster. The building is again stepped back into the roofline, and to accommodate the observatory, the offices were moved to the thrid floor, and again a small roof deck completes the look from the water. We could put the offices on the second floor, but then wouldn't have the height to incorporate the observatory feature. The third floor is actually a "half story" and is built into the roofline. So what's next? In late June, the City Council appropriated funds to acquire three homes and the Louis Parking Lot. Over the summer, the city contracted with Tighe and Bond to manage the negotiation and acquisition process. In early September, the parcels will be assessed and negotiations will begin. If property owners are willing to sell, the Mayor's Office will present the acquisitions to the City Council and the matters will be voted on. Once we have a commitment of what land is available, we can finalize the design. The ramp and environmental permits are being amended. Once approved, we will need to demolish the existing Maritime Center to build the ramp. The existing ramp will remain operational while the new ramp is under construction. All funds committed to this project have been received from grants from the Seaport Economic Council and Community Preservation. The funds for the property acquisitions will come from the Hotel/Motel Tax revenue. I welcome anyone to contact me with questions. My cell # 617-834-5716.
