

TCMAFC Presidents Letter

March 2023

Now that it is March, I'm thinking we are about to enter our spring time. I don't know about you, but I'm getting anxious to getting my car out on the road and going for a cruise. Our February Restoration clinic had Brad Nelson presenting on Rust removal. The method that Brad presented was the least caustic of the removals that I've heard of for our environment and his results were proof that it worked out well. We also were going to spend time on accessories that people had and there were several that people had on display. We may need to expand this topic and do another clinic on it as there was a lot of interest and we just didn't get everything covered. That leads me to two thoughts, 1) Our clinics are indeed growing and we do generate a lot of questions during our presentations. It is fantastic to see the interest and the questions as it helps everyone understand the topic a bit better. 2) Ideas for more clinics. It was mentioned by Vice Smith that he and Brad Nelson should do a clinic on how to tell if a part is original or reproduction. GREAT IDEA – while our schedule is set for the remainder of this year, it's time to start getting ideas generated for the clinics that will start up again next fall. Remember, none of us are professional speakers, we just like sharing information. We can help you make your presentation if you have a topic. Just reach out to Dale Pomerleau or myself and we can get you started.

At the March Restoration Clinic Dale Pomerleau and I spoke of a project we were putting together. Dale took the TCMAFC Restoration Manual (the blue binder that we hand out to new members at the clinics) and scanned it into a searchable PDF document. I took all of the various Restoration Clinic presentations that I had on the laptop that I bring to project the presentations. I had clinic presentations that dated back to 2015. I took those presentations and saved them as a PDF. We also got fashion clinic presentations in PDF format from Deb Persing. I took all of this material and put it on a few DVD Discs for a few members to try out. So far, we are successful! Our next task was to try and record the restoration clinics. While there are several ways to do this, I decided to try a two for one method were I set up a zoom call and turned on recording of the zoom. So a few members who could not be in attendance could be part of the clinic but we also got a recording. AND... we had success again.

Our next step was to collect the clinics from some of the presenters when I was not in attendance. Once that is done, we will burn several discs and hand them out. I know some of you don't have a disc drive so we are also looking into other methods including putting the material on the website or having jump drives available.

February Restoration Clinic

We had a busy night, it seems that nearly 60 members were looking for an excuse to come out in the cold and it's because we have great content at our Clinics!


We tried to add a little something extra by now letting members zoom in to this night. We are trying this out and it seems to be working but we are always looking for feedback on how this is going.


With a Swap Meet to kick off the evening where members bring items to sell and time to socialize we have a busy first half of the evening.

Our topic this night was presented by Brad Nelson who has proffesional experience in the auto body trade. He gave a presentation on dealing with and removing rust. His presentation was using the method of electrolosyis. This is done with farily cheap and obtainable supplies . To take a very simplisite explaination this is a process of reverse plating where you pull off the rust particles. You create a tank to hold the item in a mixture of water and washing soda. you them use a DC power source (battery charger works fine) and some copper wire attached to some clean scrap steel. You leave the item in the bath turn on the power and wait a reasonable amount of time.

Brad used an auto body hood and showed us the results, and a few of the best outcomes of the process is that is gentle, does not warp parts like sandblasting and the resulting solution is not a hazourdous waste or a dangerous chemical to deal with. Brad is a trained proffesional in body work and painting and he was very happy with the rust removal and the surface that one needs to deal with for the painting process. The one safety concern would be to have good ventilation to remove the hydrogen gas that is generated thru this process. Doing this in a ventilated area moving air to the outside should be no problem.

Our second segment dealt with accesories that were created for the Model A by a great number of manufacures other than the Ford Motor Company. Heaters, dress up items, anti theft items, dubious items claiming to increase horsepower and increase fuel mileage. Doug Pomerleau brought in a large collection of items and showed them off. We ran short of time and hopefully we again try to do more on this topic.







Simple tank, washing soda & clean steel attached to


















This book is avaiable from the clubs library (book # 122) which contains over 200 pages of photos and desctptions. It is also available from most parts venders.
