"FEAR, Is What's Going on in the World Today!" - Part 2 By Wade Anderson

You all know I share my own life's experiences here with prayerful expectation that, as a testimony, it will help set others free. I know that God's Word is true, and He is faithful to His Word. The particular Scripture that I'm standing on, for this portion of this message is, "And they overcame him (satan) by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony, ..." (Revelation 12:11)

Early on in this message I told you I would go back to the Virus message I spoke about in the September issue of the newsletter. And this is where the above Scripture in Revelation comes into effect, as a brief testimony.

Early in August I flew to Colorado to attend a *Healing is Here Conference*. Please remember, we don't have to go to a healing conference in order to be healed. I go to these conferences with a spirit of expectation, to soak up the wisdom that has gathered there. It's at these events that the Holy Spirit brings revelation to me, and I begin to tweak the words that I speak and gain a deeper understanding of the authority I have in Christ Jesus. In other words, I'm continually building on the foundation that was first built in me by my Living Word "spiritual grandparents", Dr.'s Tom and Maureen Anderson. Anyways, I was there at the conference from August 9th – 13th. I normally stay a couple extra days after the conferences to just kick it with the brothers there, but I knew Michelle and I were flying out to Ohio for five days on the 18th of August. We were excited to watch Dylan play football. I had some things that needed to get done at home before we left so I didn't hang out there in the beautiful pines of Colorado.

Dylan is our 2nd oldest grandson. He plays football for the same high school that I attended. Even before high school, Dylan loved football. Even in the 6th and 7th grade the head coach seen Dylan's heart and passion and took him under his wing. He plays center and defensive linebacker. Dylan lettered all four years of high school, and this is his senior year. This means these games were going to be his last year and this was the first game of the season. Most of the line had been working and training together since the 6th and 7th grade and they were a force to be reckoned with! They trained hard and they played together like a well-oiled machine. By the way, they smoked the other school 48 - 12!

After our time there in Ohio, Michelle and I flew home on the 23rd of August. I was home one day and on the 25th I jumped in the truck, with my longtime brother Blake, and we headed for Moses Lake, Washington. A Veteran friend and his wife live there, and they had a couple of out buildings that needed the roofing taken off, some plywood replaced and a new metal roof installed. Tom is in his 80's and just had some heart work done so we decided to run up there and keep him off of the roof of these buildings. Tom and his wife, Callie, own and have completely built two acres of lawn, fruit trees, grapes and a huge garden together, and all from a dirt field. Anyways, they put us up there at their place and fed us WAY TOO MUCH while we fixed their buildings. Let's stop right there for a minute as I shift gears for a second.

I won't use all of it, but these next few paragraphs are from President Roosevelt's inaugural speech.

In 1932, Franklin D. Roosevelt was campaigning against Herbert Hoover in the presidential election. His first inaugural address took on an unusually solemn, religious quality. And for good reason, by 1933 the depression had reached its depth. In Roosevelt's first inaugural address, he outlined in broad terms how he hoped to govern and reminded Americans that the nation's "common difficulties" concerned "only material things." He went on to say...

In such a spirit on my part and on yours we face our common difficulties. They concern, thank God, only material things. Values have shrunken to fantastic levels; taxes have risen; our ability to pay has fallen; government of all kinds is faced by serious curtailment of income; the means of exchange are frozen in the currents of trade; the withered leaves of industrial enterprise lie on every side; farmers find no markets for their produce; the savings of many years in thousands of families are gone.

More important, a host of unemployed citizens face the grim problem of existence, and an equally great number toil with little return. Only a foolish optimist can deny the dark realities of the moment. Yet our distress comes from no failure of substance. We are stricken by no plague of locusts. Compared with the perils which our forefathers conquered because they believed and were not afraid, we have still much to be thankful for. Nature still offers her bounty and human efforts have multiplied it. Plenty is at our doorstep, but a generous use of it languishes in the very sight of the supply.

The measure of the restoration lies in the extent to which we apply social values more noble than mere monetary profit. Happiness lies not in the mere possession of money; it lies in the joy of achievement, in the thrill of creative effort. The joy and moral stimulation of work no longer must be forgotten in the mad chase of evanescent profits. These dark days will be worth all they cost us if they teach us that our true destiny is not to be ministered unto but to minister to ourselves and to our fellow men.

Recognition of the falsity of material wealth as the standard of success goes hand in hand with the abandonment of the false belief that public office and high political position are to be valued only by the standards of pride of place and personal profit; and there must be an end to a conduct in banking and in business which too often has given to a sacred trust the likeness of callous and selfish wrongdoing. Small wonder that confidence languishes, for it thrives only on honesty, on honor, on the sacredness of obligations, on faithful protection, on unselfish performance; without them it cannot live. Restoration calls, however, not for changes in ethics alone. This Nation asks for action, and action now.

In the field of world policy, I would dedicate this Nation to the policy of the good neighbor—the neighbor who resolutely respects himself and, because he does so, respects the rights of others—the neighbor who respects his obligations and respects the sanctity of his agreements in and with a world of neighbors.

If I read the temper of our people correctly, we now realize as we have never realized before our interdependence on each other; that we cannot merely take but we must give as well; that if we are to go forward, we must move as a trained and loyal army willing to sacrifice for the good of a common discipline, because without such discipline no progress is made, no leadership becomes effective.

We do not distrust the future of essential democracy. The people of the United States have not failed. In their need they have registered a mandate that they want direct, vigorous action. They have asked for discipline and direction under leadership. In this dedication of a Nation we humbly ask the blessing of God. May He protect each and every one of us. May He guide me in the days to come.

He said "The only thing we have to **fear is fear itself**" meaning we don't need to be **afraid** of anything other than being **afraid** — if everyone will remain calm, the troubles can be sorted out and addressed, but if people panic and stampede, things will only get worse. So, I ask you to meditate on these few paragraphs and see if you don't find a little peace in knowing; yes, there is a real virus, but we don't approach it with fear. Instead face everything with the confidence that God's Word is the only complete truth! Fear has the tendency to magnify the issues in our lives, where faith in God always minimizes them and magnifies our God. Let's continue with our road trip to Washington and Oregon.

A couple of days into our stay there and Blake started feeling pretty sickly. We shrugged it off and kept moving forward as we had already booked three different fishing trips in Oregon. Let me say right here, all the time we were gone I was reading the Bible along with a healing book I'd picked up there at the Healing Is Here Conference while I was in Colorado a couple of weeks before this. As we left Washington, the further we drove the more evident it became that Blake was truly not well. All the way to the coast of Oregon, I was confessing God's promises over both of us. We checked into our room and turned in to get some sleep because we were headed out on the ocean on a charter boat for cod and rockfish at 4:15 am. The swells that day were somewhere between 4'–6'. We fished hard, filled our limits and limits for a couple other people. When we got back to the motel, we both were pretty worn out. We took LONG HOT showers and settled in to allow our bodies to rest before we had to get back up, for the second day at 4:15 am.

As I woke that morning, I took another hot shower and then realized that Blake was still not moving about. This would be another day on the ocean, so together we decided it would be best if he stayed in the room to rest as our next, and final fishing day was to be a chartered river trip for salmon. All the way to the dock, I kept confessing God's promises over both of us. By the time the charter hit the fishing area, the winds had picked up and the swells were between 10' and 12'. With that much motion I hugged the rail and fished to catch my limit, plus. But boy howdy, when I got back to the room, I was EXHAUSTED and beat up.

Again, after another LONG HOT shower I wrapped up in all the blankets available, and with the lights out, Blake, kind of under his breath said, "I'm only going to say this once, and even at that, softly, do you think we might have COVID?" I instantly responded, "ABSOLUTELY NOT!" That next morning on the Coos River, fishing for salmon, I just couldn't shake the cold off. It wasn't that cold out, but I was chilled clear to the bone. So much so that the captain gave me his personal Carhart jacket AND kept turning the boat in order to have the sunshine directly on me. Again, we fished for six hours, and caught two salmon. I usually don't tap out when it comes to fishing, but I seriously had to that day. I've fished with that captain before, so when I tapped out, he knew I was in a serious way. Once again, we headed back to the room to take hot showers and get packed so we could leave, as my brother Monty says, at 0'dark 30.

The next morning, we finished loading the truck, mustered all the energy we had, got in and headed to Arizona. We drove from 5:30 am to 9:00 pm, and somewhere in the high desert of California we got a room and passed out. Of course, after a LONG HOT shower. We woke up early and rolled out. On the road I called Michelle and told her to lock down the house, I was homeward bound, and I was not feeling well at all! We drove the wheels off the truck, and we were home by 4pm on Saturday. You may be wondering why I'm telling you all of this? Because I'm going somewhere, just hold on.

Throughout this whole trip I read and confessed God's promises over the things that were trying to manifest in each of us. I was reading the Bible and as I said earlier, I was also reading a book on healing. My flesh was weak, but my spirit never bowed. Reaching home, I slept for two days and on Monday I called the doctor and had him send some antibiotics to the

Here is a little sermon I wrote for all of you at Overcomers for Office. We would love to be perfect every day. A good Christian will feel bad.

1 John 2:1 – "My little children, these things I write to you, so that you may not sin. And if anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous." Jesus is our advocate. Don't persecute yourself, it keeps us trapped in sin. When we don't look for a way to sin and get by with it, God sees our heart.

Foot's Bible Study

Jeremiah 48:1-49:22

God cannot tolerate pride because pride is taking personal credit for what God has done or looking down on others. God does not condemn our taking satisfaction in what we do, (Ecclesiastes 3:22) but he stands against our estimates of our own importance. Romans 12:3 teaches us to have an honest estimate of ourselves. (48:29)

Edom was located in a rock fortress that today is known as Petra in Southern Jordan. Edom thought it was invincible because of its location. Edom was destroyed because of its pride. Pride destroys nations as well as individuals. It deludes us into thinking that we can take care of ourselves without God's help. Even serving God and others can lead us to pride. Take inventory of your life and service for God, ask God to point out and remove any pride you may be harboring. (49:16)

2 Timothy 4:1-22

We should always be ready to serve God in any situation whether or not it is convenient. Be sensitive to the opportunities God gives you. (4:2)

Psalm 95:1-96:13

When people become so stubbornly set in their ways that their heart is hardened, they find it impossible to turn to God. This does not happen all at once it is the result of a series of choices to disregard God's will. If you resist long enough, God may toss you aside like hardened bread, useless and worthless. (95:8)

Proverbs 26:9-12

Normally, the first prick of a thorn alerts us, so we remove the thorn before it damages us. A drunk person, however, may not feel the thorn, and so it will work its way into his flesh. Similarly, a fool may not feel the sting of a proverb because he does not see how it applies to his life. Instead of taking its point to heart, a fool will apply it to his church, his employer, his spouse, or whomever he is rebelling against. The next time you find yourself saying, "So and so should really pay attention to that." Stop and ask yourself, "Is there a message in it for me?" (26:9)

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pharmacy for me. My energy level was at minus 10. Tuesday was my 4th day home, and because Michelle was fine, we decided that we should wear masks every time I came out of the spare room, I was holed up in. The doctor suggested we both get tested for COVID so on Wednesday we took the test. The next day we found out that I tested positive, but Michelle was negative. By the weekend, I was starting to feel semi better but now Michelle was feeling puny. This time when she was tested it came back that she was now positive. The whole month of September we were locked in, away from the world together. Being mindful of other people, we didn't go to church or even see our kids or grandkids the whole time. All the time this was going on neither of us took our eyes off of Jesus. Neither of us went to the hospital and we never went on a ventilator. This is the part that I know God wanted me to share with all of you. In the first paragraph and the prayer in last month's newsletter, I spoke about the words I was going to speak, under the Blood of Jesus. And now the stage is set.

As I was sort of getting my feet back under me, and continuing to read the Bible, it was harder than it had ever been to comprehend what I was reading. Reading two verses at a time was really confusing. So much so that I HAD to read them out loud. Even reading them out loud was a challenge. Somewhere out of left field I began to be angry, judgmental and very critical. I'd never experienced these kinds of feelings and emotions, to this level since I was deep in the world. Like I mentioned, whatever was going on inside of me, at that point, reading the Bible was bringing me no peace, that I could consciously tell. But I kept reading because I knew it wasn't God's Word that was the issue. It had to be the enemy doing his best to beat me up while I was in the state I was in. My strength was slowly returning but my mental and spiritual state were a wreck!

You all know that I love to ride my motorcycle, right?! The weather was amazing at this time in September, so I pulled my bike out and decided I was going for a ride. When I hit the freeway, I decided 'I' was going to go to Black Canyon City and get a piece of pie. As I was riding North, I looked up and saw one of those overhead electronic billboards. It read, "65% of Arizona has been vaccinated. Do your part and get the shot." When I read that sign, something inside of me rose up, and what I said and did OUT LOUD, I'm grateful only God and myself heard. Instantly anger rose up from somewhere inside of me and I told myself I was just going to ride long and hard until I felt peace again. My new intentions were to now run up to Flagstaff, like I thought I could outrun the ugliness inside of me. But first I got off at Rock Springs to get that piece of pie. As I entered the restaurant, I was so confused that I couldn't even agree with myself on a piece of pie. I turned right around and walked out. As I reached my motorcycle, I realized I was completely out of breath with no strength, and questioned if I could even hold her up to ride home. I knew that if I could hold her up and maneuver through the parking lot to the road, all I had to do was twist the throttle and hold on because she knew her way home. I reached the house, opened the gate, and put my motorcycle away. It was a real chore to get to the house. When I opened the door and went into the kitchen, I was panting so hard that Michelle asked me, "Are you okay?" Without an answer I went in, changed my clothes, and went to bed. The anger was right at the tip of my tongue, and I wasn't going to allow that 'other guy' to have a conversation with her, I thought that if I went to bed, when I woke up, I wouldn't feel the same way, WELL, THAT DIDN'T WORK! When I got up it was as though those issues had intensified! Right out of left field I began to have an attitude with one of my pastors. Why?! We hadn't even spoken in over a month. Why was I so angry and negative of him? The more I tried to get past it all, the more I saw my foundation was being attacked. That was when I truly began to realize that I was being blindsided by the enemy.

The next afternoon Michelle and I went to our kid's house to pick up the flash drive to print the first read of the newsletter. For some reason, by the time Michelle got back in the car and we started for home, she could feel the presence of the enemy so heavy that she said to me, "Wade, it's almost like you were in the world again. With everything as good as it is at this point in our lives, it feels like you have no peace or joy?" That did it, I yelled at the top of my labored voice, "I DON'T HAVE ANY PEACE! AND I DON'T HAVE ANY JOY! I LOVE JESUS AND I KNOW HE LOVES ME BUT I HAVE NO PEACE OR JOY! I'M JUST GOING TO GET ON MY MOTORCYCLE AND RIDE UNTIL I LOSE THESE FEELINGS!" Remember, the day before this I didn't have enough energy to ride past Rock Springs. Why was I lashing out like this when I already knew I didn't have the strength to ride even that far? Needless to say, that brought her to a place I'd not seen her in a long time, to tears. It was her wisdom and her tears that opened my eyes and my heart. Seeing her in that condition, because of the way I was acting, brought me to my senses and to tears. My position as her husband is to build her up and lift her up, not tear her up on the inside. At that point, I closed my mouth and opened my heart to listen to her. When I did begin to speak, the first place I went to was to apologize for my actions and make her feel the way that I had.

I'd never felt the way that I was in a long time. I soon realized that whatever it was that crawled up on me was satan himself. The liar thought, in my new weakness, this would be his opportunity to sucker punch me. He knew his little minions wouldn't be enough, so he came personally.

From that point, I became even more persistent to read the Bible, with understanding. As I was praying for guidance and the Holy Spirit's help, I felt prompted in my spirit to start reading in the Book of Romans. Even though I've read Romans

many times I knew that my obedience to His voice would definitely be one of the keys that would stop the enemy. At first it was still a real challenge to understand what I was reading.
