
















BACK TO OUR ROOTS

Both Westbury Community Gardeners and Westbury residents enjoyed the beautiful weather while engaging all their senses in an immersive herbal experience. The participants were encouraged to taste and smell a variety of herbs and then made a vinegar infusion of selected herbs. Many of the gardeners were new to using herbs and we hope that they continue to enjoy these useful plants.


We had so much fun teaching this class that we didn't get any work done in the garden! In spite of this, the garden looks fabulous!! Calendula and chamomile, our cool weather herbs, are enjoying the cooler evening temperatures and blooming like crazy!











We have put in two "old-school" medicinal herbs, clary sage and skullcap, recently and are looking forward to seeing what happens to them. We have roselle and lemon verbena to transplant. Of course, we are also on the lookout for the appearance of our hot weather herbs, butterfly blue pea and tulsi (holy basil), as the weather warms up.
