e seemingly live in a world where someone always wants something from us, and they want it right now. Bills arrive

in the mail with upcoming due dates. Our schedules get filled with appointments to keep and errands to do. We seemingly always have a missed call to return, a text going unanswered.

or an email that needs a response.

One of my admitted weaknesses is the desire to control my time. I like to feel "in charge" of my time, how I spend it, when I spend it, and making the most of my productivity with the time I have. I sometimes get short and frustrated when I feel that too much of my time is being taken or controlled by other things.

This proverb raises an interesting point: what if you can do good in a person's life, but your preference is to do that good at another time? Maybe an opportunity to converse with a

> neighbor presents itself, but you want to get to the bank or grocery store right now. Perhaps you want to get inside to do the laundry because it is nagging you to get it done now.

> > We can think, "It is my neighbor; I see them frequently. I will have time

tomorrow." Let's be honest. How often do we follow up on that tomorrow? What truly happens? We keep pushing it down our to-do lists.

The truth is God gives us our time. God gives us each new day, each hour, each minute. God places us in our neighborhoods, households, workplaces, and spaces where we spend most of that precious time. God creates those opportunities, those divine appointments,



which we never schedule, to do good, to have the power to act.

When we withhold good, we tell God we are better at prioritizing our time than he is! Because why would God choose now to do good? Wouldn't it be better when it is more convenient for us?

I am at the front of the line of being guilty of this offense, to see opportunities to do good as an offense to my perfect time strategy. When I look back, I realize all those significant things. They did get completed. The ones that did not? They probably were not that important. But the missed opportunities to do good? Yeah, that can sting.

But God gives us still more chances. The opportunities to do good to those we see all the time present themselves often. How can we lay

down our desire to master and control our time and give that control over to God, the one who gives us all our time to start with? It starts with that mindset: when God gives me something in abundance, I should honor God with it.

Make time. Allow God to intervene in your schedules, minutes, and plans. Allow God to surprise you with opportunities to do good. When you have the power to act, act accordingly.

### Missions | Updates on the Moyer Family and Mary Hopkins

elow are updates from two missionaries we support as a church - The Moyer family, part of World Team in France, and Mary Hopkins, working with Wycliffe (SIL) in Arizona.

Chris Moyer and his family help facilitate a church plant in France, north of Paris. As well as his duties helping World Team's missionary families live well in their new countries, he teams up with his son to bake chocolate chip cookies. This is a great way to reach out to the French families they live near. All three of the Moyer children play basketball, giving them opportunities to show God's love.

Mary Hopkins now lives in Tucson, and many of her duties changed over the past few months. She says, "I have had a burst of learning new processes in my job managing the personnel database (called Workday) for our group of Mexico SIL members. It seems as if every week brings some new procedure I haven't yet mastered that I have to work on. We have a monthly Workday Community of Practice meeting where we can ask questions and learn procedures and find out about modifications to the program which is of great help."

She adds, "I am almost finished working on the Zapotec dictionary that I have been helping to format since early last year, I hope. Every time I think we are done, something else comes up ... I am also in the process of checking a book in another variety of Zapotec about how the community plants beans and squash in their fields along with the traditional corn plants."
