

John 20:19-30



"On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. These are written that you may come to believe.

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

Divine Mercy Sunday Year B

John 20:19-3

It's like *Groundhog Day* all over again! We hear in today's gospel of that *First Day of the Week* in John chapter 20 when Jesus rose from the dead-Easter! *It had been a long, full day*. It began early (Jn 20:1 "while it was still dark") first with the discovery of the empty tomb, and then containing various appearances of Jesus, first to Mary Magdalene (Jn 20:16) and then here to the rest of the apostles (except Thomas). *What an eventful day!* But it only gets better, because Jesus will be back again, which brings us to today (Jn 20:26 'Now a week later'). Jesus appears again to everyone, plus Thomas this time, and Jesus' first word, just like last week is 'Peace be with you' (Jn 20:26). I love that! This is actually the *third time* Jesus has wished them 'Peace' (Jn 20:19, 21 & 26) I expect His threefold wish of peace, is a nod to Peter to begin forgiving himself for denying knowledge of and friendship with Jesus back on the night of Jesus' arrest (Jesus will fully redeem this sin of Peter in John 21:15-17) That is our merciful Shepherd, which brings us to why we call this 2nd Sunday of Easter, *Divine Mercy* Sunday! What is Divine Mercy? Basically, Jesus defines it Himself, in John 3:17, that "God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him". Jesus came back resurrected, not to condemn but to save!

Divine Mercy is the offer of forgiveness and reconciliation from God to us after we sin and reject Him. Specifically in today's gospel, notice what Jesus does in these first appearances to the group of apostles after His terrible torture and death on the cross and their abandonment of Him. He reveals His true redeeming ministry of reconciliation. Jesus gives 1) peace, 2) the Holy Spirit and 3) authority to 'forgive sins in His name' (Jn 20:21-23). In 2 Corinthians 5:18-19 St Paul reminds us that "all this is from God, who has reconciled us to himself through Christ and given us the ministry of reconciliation..... and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation." So this gift of Jesus further invite sus to join His work of reconciliation. Not Easy! Ask any mediator, any referee if their work is easy! They will share what grief comes to them when they step between squared off enemies, trying to reconcile the opposing parties. When I was a kid, I learned that it is the person breaking up the fight, that gets broken themselves, as they absorb punches from both sides (or mistakenly gets grabbed by the principal and accused of being the cause of the melee). Jesus on the cross is exactly in that position – standing between us and our sin and on the other side the death that results from our wayward disobedience. Colossians 1:20 says it this way: Jesus came "to reconcile all things for God, making peace by the blood of his cross." Jesus steps in to save us, uniting and reconciling us back to the Father by His own suffering and crucifixion for us. Ephesians 2:14 & 16 summarizes the saving action of Jesus so well: "For he {Jesus} is our peace, he who made both one and broke down the dividing wall of enmity, through his flesh......thus establishing peace, to reconcile both with God, in one body, through the cross, putting that enmity to death by it." What an awesome act of mercy! Divine, we say! And maybe we should not be surprised at the overwhelming goodness of God reflected in Jesus' first act after rising from the dead being 'forgiveness' of the past. Jesus gave a glimpse of 'reconciliation' ahead, when he forgave his tormentors even as he stood about to be crucified, in Luke 23:34 "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." He had all but told Peter the same, when he predicted Peter's cowardly denials., Jesus hinted at forgiveness to come telling Peter, "I have prayed that your own faith may not fail; and once you have turned back, you must strengthen your brothers" (Luke 22:32). Jesus suggests to Peter a role of leadership in this 'reconciling ministry' of the cross: forgiving enemies and bringing opponents together in peace. And keep watching through the Eater season, as we continue to see how loving forgiveness and compassionate mercy drives the engine of conversion growing the church in time and bearing great fruit through the spread of Jesus' Name to all the world! And even today, we have a powerful role to play in being co-workers in Jesus' ministry of reconciliation, because we have received God's Mercy. Who better to share a gift, than a person who has received it? SO it all began, by the apostles receiving and accepting the gift of mercy/forgiveness, and turning to the world to announce and administer such mercy to others! If we have experienced God's Mercy, then we are eager to share it! Easter Peace, Fr Brian
