

Pastor's thoughts ...

Hello Beloved St. Mark's Lutheran Family,

I am willing to bet that I had our Christmas tree up earlier than anyone else. You see, I got a Christmas tree when mom moved, and knowing that I didn't have a good way to store it I set it up out on the porch. And I didn't take it down. It's been up ever since. But I did wait until Thanksgiving to turn the lights on. My original plan was to turn it into a "holiday tree" – with decorations for each of the holidays throughout the year. Now it waits... to be decorated when the girls come home.

Perhaps it was because when I got married my oldest daughter Faith and I had this tree, our special tree, one I bought off the display at Walmart and convinced the manager to give us a discount on. It was our daddy daughter tree. Now, when Kari and I got married, our families combined we got another tree... but Faith and I put up our special tree out on the porch. We'd decorate it together, we'd listen to Christmas music and it was good. So that special tree is in the living room now, and this newly acquired tree is on the porch. And I like it that way, always present, always reminding of good times, and that Christmas is never really that far off.

It is a source of pride among many Lutherans to believe that they invented the candlelit Christmas tree in Germany and brought it to the United States in the 1800s. There is some historical evidence that German Christians were the first people to have Christmas trees indoors, one to the earliest recorded was in 1605 in Strasbourg. But even back further, evergreens were believed to have mystical powers as far back as ancient Egypt and Babylon. The Romans decorated with greens for the celebration of Saturnalia, a celebration held around the time of the winter solstice. Closer to our Lutheran roots, it is a widely held belief that it was Martin Luther that first added lighted candles to a tree. According to a common version of the story, walking home one winter evening, Luther was awed by the stars twinkling amidst evergreens. To recapture the scene for his family, he erected a tree in the main room and wired its branches with lighted candles. That seems so dangerous... a live tree with lit candles on it. Newer innovations, like pre-lit artificial trees are probably much safer, but I must admit, there is something special about a live tree.

A fun thing to do with your children or grandchildren this time of year is to tell the stories of the Christmas trees of your own childhood. We all have memories of our first tree; whether you remember trudging through the woods or snow to cut down your own, driving to the lot to buy one, or the first time your family settled for a "fake tree". It is good to remember and recounted those stories.

One of my favorite things about our Christmas trees, they are reminders. And it is trees that bookend the story of Jesus. We use an evergreen tree to celebrate Jesus' birth – and a cross made of wood to remember his death. Presents under the tree remind us of the gift of God's love. The evergreen nature of the tree reminds us of everlasting life with Christ. The angels we put on top guiding our eyes heavenward remind us of Gabriel coming to Mary with amazing news, and appearing to the shepherds in the fields announcing the Savior's birth. Perhaps you put a star on top, reminding you of the Star that shone over Bethlehem that night.

In church Christmas is celebrated over two weeks, but Christ coming into our world...to live, teach, heal, forgive, and save us... we can celebrate that all year long! I'm praying your Advent is good, your Christmas is full of good memories, and that your New Year is truly blessed.
