Dear Friends in Christ,

When you receive this it will be November, the time we start thinking of celebrating wonderful holidays: Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year's. We look forward to festive times with families and friends as well as rich worship services: the lighting of candles on the Advent wreath at all of our churches, all leading up to the candlelight Christmas Eve services at Third Lutheran in Rhinebeck and St. Paul's in Red Hook, culminating with the lovely intimate Christmas Day service at 10 AM at Memorial Lutheran.

These are all wonderful blessings for us, yet, as we know, in other parts of the world there are always troubles that we are aware of. At this time, we are hearing of the horrific situation in Israel and Gaza with Israel calling for the civilians of Gaza to evacuate, pending a potential military action by Israel. There have already been well over 1,000 deaths, and countless people have been wounded. Hospitals are very close to running out of medicine, water, and food.

Even if this crisis were to be resolved quickly, there is a tremendous need for humanitarian aid. The Lutheran Parish of Northern Dutchess has always been generous in responding to disasters in our country and around the world. As we "count our blessings" in these festive times, I ask you to support Lutheran agencies who are at work directing humanitarian aid. Thoughts from the President @ Third

It has been a busy summer for property projects this year beginning with the replacement of all the roofs and gutters. Next came the long-awaited rebuild of the front stone steps followed by installation of the central dehumidifier. A new Memorial Plaque was installed in the Memorial Garden and the following names were added: Rev. Leonard Torcello, pastor at Third from the mid 1970's to the late 1980's; Kevin Russell, and Billy Russell.

During Pastor Torcello's tenure the congregation experienced a vibrant spiritual and social life focusing on worship, fellowship, and service. Major activities included the DC Fair Food Booth serving hot roast beef sandwiches among other goodies, ham dinners, Couples Club, Youth Group, Agape Feast, Easter Vigils, Church picnics, implementation of every Sunday Communion and some other worship service refinements, Confirmation examinations I have pleasant memories of Youth Group activities including raking huge volumes of maple leaves from the lawn, 25-mile walk-a-thons (he did loops in the car to check on us), and the highlight of the summer - a week at his family camp on Great Sacandaga Lake in the Adirondacks! The day began with all you can eat pancakes prepared by his wife Eleanor followed by a Bible study session and then we were free to swim, hike along the shore, play games, or he would take us on a ride in his boat or at times sneak up on us on the dock (big guy that he was) grab us and toss us into the water! As we got older, he ended up creating quite a splash on more than one occasion! One service activity has come full circle – as members of the Youth Group, we were required to serve as crucifers and acolytes on a rotating basis, now passed on to a new generation – Teddy!

There are a variety of events coming up over the next few weeks in which all members of the Parish are invited to attend. These include Pumpkin Carving at Third, candy distribution on Halloween at Third, Oktoberfest at St. Paul's, and the Thanksgiving Service at St. Paul's. More details can be found elsewhere in this newsletter. This year we will not be participating in the village Sinterklaas activities. Instead, we are planning an Advent Festival at Third! Activities are in the planning stages so please watch for further details in the weeks ahead.



Men are in need of suits, dress shirts, ties, belts and shoes, while women are in need of dresses, skirts, slacks, blouses and shoes. All donated items must be clean and in good condition.

It would be great to have this be a parish-wide event. And thus, members of St. Paul's and Memorial are invited to bring clothing to their church. 
